"One can have pizzas and burgers at a nominal rate. For instance, the pizza costs just ₹25."

The best thing about Munchies is that the food is prepared only after an order is placed. "The chef starts to prepare the food only after we give our coupons.

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They serve fresh and hygienic food," says Reba, a faculty member.

For hostelite Steffi T Mampilly, the cafeteria food is a welcome change. "One can also see the on-campus golf

course from Munchies. It's a treat for the eyes and a great place to relax," she says.

You also get different sandwiches and juices at Munchies. "My favourite is the corn cheese sandwich and lemon juice. I can have this combo anytime," says Mampilly. Sandwiches cost ₹25, while fresh juices is just ₹20.

Though, one can have a taste of a variety of cuisines, right from Chinese to Italian, Munchies is a pure vegetarian cafeteria as it belongs to Jain University.
