The **Consultation Seminar on Indian Psychology: Challenges and Prospects** is being organised to mark the inauguration of the Centre for the Indian Psychology at Jain University, Bangalore, with the sponsorship of the Indian Council of Philosophical Research (ICPR), New Delhi, to meet the following objectives:

1. To provide a platform for leading scholars to elucidate the present status, challenges and prospects of Indian Psychology.

The Centre aspires to contribute to Indian Psychology by undertaking research work in the field in order to create a strong theoretical foundation as well as to evolve methods that would facilitate the study and applications of IP in academics and in the professional domain.
