

Faculty of the Postgraduate Department of Psychology participate in two major Academic Programmes in Sri Lanka

The Faculty of the Postgraduate Department of Psychology embarked on an academic trip to Sri Lanka with two separate agendas during the last week of October 2014. They conducted a Workshop at Jaffna University and also presented papers and Chaired sessions at the ICAP Conference.

Workshop at Jaffna University:

A one day workshop for undergraduate and postgraduate students of Psychology on '*Psychology to Promote Sustainable Well-being*' was conducted on the 21 October, 2014. Dr. Sherin P Antony, Dr. C Gnanaprakash and Ms. Ashwini, Assistant Professors at the Department of Psychology, Jain University were the resource persons. A total of 125 students attended the sessions besides 10 faculty members. They were from the Departments of Psychology, Philosophy and English Literature. Themes addressed at the workshop included dealing with Child Sexual Abuse, Happiness and the Scope of Psychology in today's world. Students spoke of the need for hands-on training on counselling and training skills. Many queries- both personal and professional were dealt with successfully at the end of the workshop. The trainers found the university at Jaffna a very friendly and approachable place and were extended every measure of warm hospitality.

ICAP Conference:

5. 'A Study on the Effectiveness of Non-Cognitive Skill Building Programme on Academic Performance of students' authored and presented by Dr. Sowmya Puttaraju and Dr. Shailaja Shastri

Apart from the presentations, Dr. Shailaja Shastri, Professor and Head, Department of Psychology chaired a session of presentations on the 23 October 2014.

She also participated in a Panel Discussion on the theme of 'Practice of Psychology in South Asia.' She was one of three members who were part of the Panel and she specialized on the application of Psychology in Education and in the Indian context.

- Ms. Mridu M.S attended a workshop on 'Sports Psychology' conducted by Dr. Peter Terry.

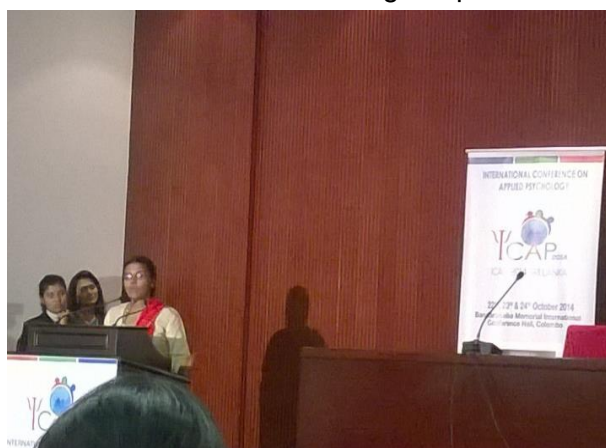
