As Jain University is a deemed university, we give concessions to scheduled caste and scheduled tribe students, based on Union government norms. Even so, many of these students prefer going to government and aided colleges, because it's simpler for them. The government quota is 27 per cent for these special categories and the seats that are not filled are added to the general merit category. Admissions to B.Com and BBM courses have been completed, but seats in the science stream have not yet been filled up, perhaps because students are waiting for CET counselling.

Our application process is quite simple. Students download the application form from the website and fill it up. The cut-off for B.Com and BBM is about 85 per cent and we follow the roster system for admissions. If a student meeting all requirements is denied a seat because there are no more available, he is put on the waiting list and is admitted if another drops out. This is the method we follow. Of course, if students come in early and have more than the required cut-off percentage, we conduct a walk-in interview for them.
