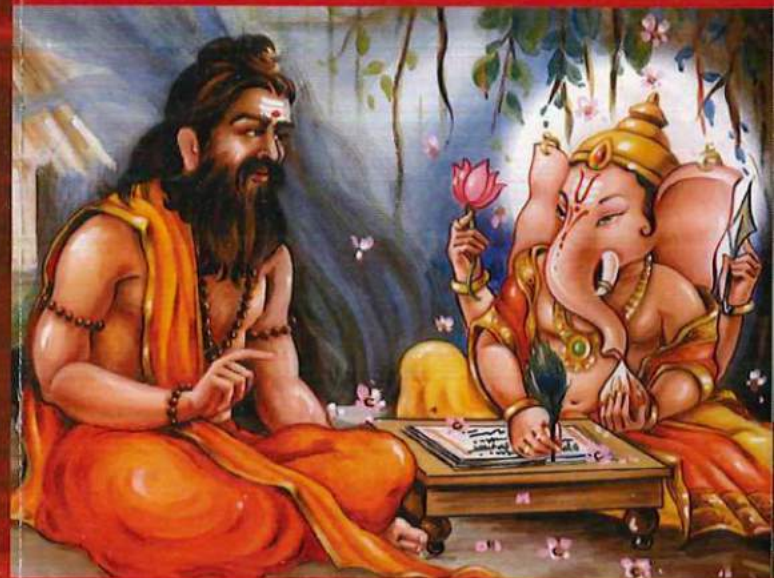

#### **CENTRE FOR ANCIENT HISTORY AND CULTURE (CAHC)**

Ancient Indian history is still depicted from a Eurocentric viewpoint. There is a need to present ancient history to younger generations in a dispassionate and objective fashion avoiding extremities of ideologies. Modern education system should be able to connect with intellectual traditions originating in ancient India. In tune with the above views, CAHC has organized several outreach activities in the last three years. Notable among these are "National Level Workshop on Manuscriptology and Paleography"(November 2012); "International Seminar On The Future Of Civilization"(December 2012). The National Conference held in August 2015 on "Intellectual Tradition of Ancient India "attracted large number of students, teachers and IT professionals of Bangalore. "Parasara-tantra", an ancient Sanskrit text on astronomy and natural sciences has been brought out with text, translation, and technical notes. Work is currently in progress for bringing out a monograph on astronomical concepts in the Puranas. Editing of rare science related manuscripts on Silpa and Jyautisa are also being undertaken at the Center.

#### **About the Course**

There are many who would like to read the Mahabharata in the original, rather than the translation. Traditional/ current methods of teaching Sanskrit become too tedious and take too long a time, years usually, to master the intricacies of the language. Language should never become a barrier when you read a technical text.

In a matter of just 30hrs, you can attain a knowledge of Sanskrit sufficient to study the Gita in the original, which will be the focus of the Course. If you are earnest, attend this course. The course is rigorous but assumes no background of Sanskrit.

The course ends with a Test.
