



### **Research Centers**

# Centre for Research in Social Sciences and Education

The Centre for Research in Social Sciences and Education (CERSSE) undertakes research in the fields of democracy and election studies, federalism, survey based research of public attitudes and developing and testing learner centered classroom dialogue materials. Its resources and expertise have been recognized by the Forum of Federations (The International Network on Federalism) and is involved in consultancy for constitutional design in the South Sudan and capacity building for transition to democracy and decentralization in Myanmar. The center has carried out a several Train the Trainer (TOT) programs and workshops funded by DFID (Canada) and Forum of Federations. CERSSE was assigned the task by the Karnataka Knowledge Commission to undertake the first ever survey based youth study in a state of India - Karnataka, to tap the aspirations, expectations and perceptions of the youth in the state.

#### **Center for Disaster Mitigation**

The Center for Disaster Mitigation (CDM) carries out research, teaching, testing and consultancy in the areas of fire and combustion, earthquakes, floods and drought and solid waste utilization. It has a tie-up with the Underwriters Laboratory of the USA for the setting up a fire testing and certification laboratory of global standards. Major projects are funded by Department of Science and Technology, Indian Institute of Science, Bhabha Atomic Research Center, Underwriters Laboratories and TYCO. The

current activities include establishment of indoor fire testing facility for UL, conducting regulatory open pool fire testing of transportation casks for radioactive materials for BARC.

#### **Center for Emerging Technologies**

The Center for Emerging Technologies (CET) is an innovative example of industryacademia interaction. It is housed at the engineering campus and focuses on research in the frontier areas of engineering. technology and science. It has a range of projects and consultancy programs with prestigious research organizations and corporate bodies across the world. Its thrust areas of research include Autonomous and Intelligent Systems (Aero & Space, Marine, Terrestrial); MEMS, Materials, Nanobio Sciences and Engineering, Rapid Prototyping and Coating, Water and Energy. CET has completed 07 sponsored projects and has about 26 sponsored ongoing projects. It collaborates with reputed organizations like the DRDO, DST, DOS-ISRO, DAE, MOFPI and MNRE and TUV Rheinland. Faculty at the center has published in leading journals and have also filed for patents. Its researchers have also developed products in collaboration with the industry. The center also runs industry linked Masters Programs.

#### **Centre for Nano and Material Sciences**

The Centre for Nano and Material Sciences (CNMS), focuses on activities on sustainable development to meet societal demands with respect to energy production, water treatment and health issues. Some of its

innovative projects include, design and development of a photoactive float for disinfection of water and elimination of emerging contaminants (pharmaceuticals, personal care products and endocrine disruptive chemicals); a nano filtration and reverse osmosis membrane based panels for complete elimination of heavy metals of serious concern such as cadmium, chromium, lead and arsenic; and a design of nanoxide supported zeolite catalysts for enhancement of octane number in petroleum products. It presently has 13 ongoing projects funded from DST (5), BRNS. MWS and MNRE.

# **Center for Research in Aerospace Engineering and Management**

The Center for Research in Aerospace Engineering and Management has a mission to generate high quality human resources and pursuing research excellence in the fields of aerospace engineering and aviation business. The special strength of the center is its orientation to meet industry needs through continuing education and enrichment programs thus addressing the needs of practitioners. The center is currently executing research projects in the areas of autonomous flights, structural health monitoring, structural damage mitigation, nano polymer composites, remote sensing using aerospace technologies and has sponsored projects from Aeronautics Research and Development Board under DRDO, on structural damage mitigation. It is supported by academic institutions and industrial organizations like ISRO, HAL, Airports Authority of India, NAL, Air India, BIAL, CIAL and many more.

### Chenraj Roychand Center for Entrepreneurship\*

The Chenraj Roychand Center for Entrepreneurship (CRCE) has done pathbreaking work in providing strategic support and mentoring entrepreneurs by venturing into the business. 40 companies have been successfully incubated. The center has developed the 21 step model to become an entrepreneur and has provided guidance and support to young entrepreneurs to give wings to their business ideas. As one of the business incubation centers of the University, CRCE plays a critical role in realizing the goals set for itself by the University in terms of entrepreneurial development. Besides, the DST has approved financial support to the Technology Business Incubator (TBI) at Jain University. Alsthom, France has also pledged support to the TBI.

#### **Fire and Combustion Research Center**

Conducting Research and Development in innovative areas has been a major objective of the Jain University. Fire safety and related combustion studies are in a state of infancy in India and promotion of R & D activities in this area will be in line objectives of Jain University. Towards this, a collaborative arrangement with UL India already exists with JGI Group for setting up a state of the art testing laboratory called Underwriters Laboratories - Jain Fire Lab (ULJFL) for fire related products at JGI Global Campus. Because of a continued testing activity, ULJFL will be in continuous live interaction with major players in global fire safety industry. This arrangement provides an excellent opportunity to develop a focused research group working in the area of fire and combustion research leading to

establishment of a research center. ULJFL interactions can be capitalized to create a research environment where frontier R & D issues of fire industry can be analyzed to frame research questions of significance to Indian context. ULJFL and its activities will render credibility to the activities of the group which can further establish relationships with renowned research groups in the areas of fire safety working in India and overseas and hence provide a global visibility.

Solving fire related problems will require engineering and technological abilities encompassing a wide range of engineering fields - civil, mechanical, electrical, electronics, computer science etc.,. Regular engineering courses at PG and UG level offered by Jain University in these streams can benefits from the activities of the center.

Specialized PG training programs in the areas of fire and combustion safety are offered to promote knowledge dissemination.

#### JU INCUBATION Center (JUIC)\*

JU INCUBATION Center (JUIC) is a joint initiative by the Department of Science and Technology (DST), Govt. of India, ALSTOM, France and Jain University. JUIC is registered in February - 2015, as not-for-profit company under Section 8 of Companies Act 2013.

DST (NSTEDB) vide in its letter number 22/16/2014-NEB dated 29.09.2015 has approved Rs.160 lakhs towards non-recuring heads of expenditure and Rs. 200 lakhs towards recurring heads of expenditure for 5 years.

ALSTOM had provided a letter of commitment to the extent of Euros 100,000 on 23-12-2014. JUIC-TBI applied to the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) for FCRA clearance on 14<sup>th</sup> May 2016. A representative from MHA also carried out an inspection during August 2016. FCRA clearance is however still awaited.

JUIC is operational from three locations in Bengaluru, namely Registered Office at JGI Global Campus, Kanakapura, City Campus at J.P Nagar 6<sup>th</sup> Phase and Entrepreneurship Factory at Jayanagar 4<sup>th</sup> Block. AT JGI Global Campus, JUIC is housed inside Jain University's School of Engineering and Technology, and thus, leverages all the resources that are accessible within the campus, such as laboratory, workshops, development and testing centers, computing resources, internet, library and above all highly experienced and knowledgeable human resource.

#### **Center for Ancient History and Culture**

The Center for Research in Ancient History and Culture (CAHC) is established with a view to present an objective analysis of Ancient Indian History. The research work in the center intends to review scholarly works on Vedic culture and present Indian history in the right perspective. The thrust areas of research include monographs on Indian astronomy before Siddhantha period, manuscriptology and to bring out a three volume encyclopedia on technical scientific terminologies used in ancient Indian literature.

# **Evaluation Process** and Reforms

At the beginning of the semester, the evaluation methods / scheme of examination are communicated to the students by the faculty. The probable dates of conduct of midterm examination, end semester examination, assessment details and guidelines are printed in the University Hand book and Academic Calendar which is distributed to each and every student. The evaluation process of the students is continuous. Signatures of the students are taken on the statements of CA (Continuous Assessment) marks to bring absolute transparency. IA (Internal Assessment) marks are displayed on the notice boards and the students can clarify IA marks with respective departments. The examination schedules, notices, timetable, etc. are put up on the website as well as on the notice board of the respective constituent units of the university. Orientation program is conducted for M.Phil. and Ph.D. students so as to brief them about the rules and regulations.

The auditorium is well equipped with modern acoustics and state-of-the-art facilities to conduct seminars, corporate events, student activities and general announcements for the students.

#### **Technology Enabled Learning (TEL)**

Jain University has been a pioneer in developing innovative learning methodologies in order to enhance the learning abilities of a student, thus providing competitive edge in professional life. Jain University has recently launched the Technology Enhanced Learning (TEL) for its various programs. The idea is to harness the power of technology and internet, in particular, so as to develop a unique method of learning process which is learner-centric.

#### **Multi-Cuisine Cafeteria**

The cafeteria is a hub of student activity, social exchange and youthful energy. Bustling with social life, it is also a place where students exchange crucial ideas, pool in effort and strategies on every day activities. #### **International Students**

International students include Foreign as well as Non-Resident Indians (NRI)

Foreign students: Students holding passports issued by foreign countries, including people of Indian origin who have acquired the nationality of foreign countries, are included as foreign students.

Non Resident Indians (NRI): Only those Non Resident Indian students who have studied and passed the qualifying examinations from

schools or colleges in foreign countries will be included as international students. This will include the students studying in the schools or colleges situated in foreign countries even if affiliated to the Boards of Secondary Education or Universities located in India, but will not include students studying in those schools or colleges (situated in India) and affiliated to the Boards of Secondary Education or Universities of the foreign countries. Students passing the qualifying examinations from Boards or Universities located in foreign countries as external students and dependents of NRI studying in India will not be included as international students.

The Office of the International Relations helps international students to adjust and fully participate in the Jain University campus community activities. The office provides orientation to the new students prior to the start of the semester. Throughout the academic year, the office provides

- English classes for the international students

The Counsellors of the Office of the International Relations help international students adjust to life at Jain University. They help new students through orientation and registration and are available round the clock to assist the students in solving the problems.

#### **Career Development Center**

The Career Development Center at Jain University provides students, the skills, confidence and networking need to launch and succeed in their chosen career. A combination of location, programs, academics and industry contacts implies that the University provides head start in profession, business, research and higher education. As a result, the University has an excellent graduate employment record and maintains good relationships with a wide cross section of organizations within a variety of industry sectors. Many key employers hold student presentations at Jain University or attend our regular career fairs.

As a student, and also after graduation, one will have full access to all the facilities at the Career Development Center. They are also helped to:

- Develop the skills that will impress future employers
- Encouraged to achieve ambitions
- Find full and part-time jobs
- · Write CVs, covering letters and application forms
- Prepare for interviews, psychometric tests and assessment centers

#### **Vishwas - Student Counselling Center**

Vishwas is the counselling center of Jain University. The counselling activities of all the centers are integrated under this center. The center is working towards mitigating the problems faced by the students. The unit counsels students and try to solve the issues related to learning problems and disabilities, substance abuse, relationship problems, personal habits, family related issues, anger management, identity and self-esteem. The counseling center was started, keeping

in mind the problems faced by the students in the tough competitive world. The center tries to solve issues related to learning problems. disabilities, relationship problems, personal habits, family related issues, anger management, problems related to identity and self-esteem, domestic violence and cultural / ethnic diversity. The Counselor suggests ways to cope or overcome the problems with relevant counselling and quidance. Confidentiality is maintained for the services and information. It is an altruistic effort on the part of the University that its services are not charged.

#### **Human Networking Academy**

A team of high profile, creative, imaginative faculty of Human Networking Academy, Jain University conducts a unique, innovative and experiential course which addresses the need to equip students with requisite knowledge and skills to strengthen their mind. The motive behind conducting this course is to create an individual who is intellectually alert, morally upright and physically strong. Awareness about our national history, culture, social responsibilities and human values is created through interactive sessions, short, silent, educational and theme based films, University documentaries and outbound learning programs.

#### **Financial Aid**

The University provides financial aid to the needy and eligible students. Merit scholarships for the meritorious students are provided every academic year. Fee concession is provided for economically weaker students and to the students belonging to disadvantaged groups. A special test for merit scholarship is conducted and the eligible students are awarded with the

scholarships. The eligibility for taking the test is 80% in the qualifying exam. Merit scholarships are given to students as an incentive for improving their performance. Sports scholarships are given to outstanding sports persons in the form of fees concessions, cash incentives, sponsorships to tournaments, etc.

# Services for the Scheduled Castes / Scheduled Tribes Students

The students belonging to Scheduled Castes / Scheduled Tribes are encouraged to take admission in Jain University. They are provided with scholarships and are encouraged to take up admissions for higher studies in the University. The University voiced the SC / ST students to get free ships from the government.

#### Women's Cell

There is a separate Women's Cell comprising of senior faculty members and two student representatives from each school / center for creating awareness to empower Women in all fields. The cell is actively involved in empowering women (both faculty and students) women students are encouraged to take part in activities related to women issues which will develop awareness about women's rights, gender sensitivity, information and empowerment. In addition, the Women's Day is also celebrated on 8th March every year.

Meetings are regularly conducted to discuss various issues like women empowerment, work life balance, developing professional competence and motivating women to become career oriented.

#### **Anti-Sexual Harassment Cell**

The cell consists of women faculty and women students as its members. The

environment is free of from any of kind of harassment or disregard to women. They are given equal opportunities in all areas of work. They are suitably appreciated for their sincere and dedicated work. The women students are encouraged to take part in co-curricular, extra-curricular and sports activities. There is absolutely no gender bias on the campus.

The cell takes certain preventive measures to maintain discipline and code of conduct are formulated, such as use of separate staircase and elevator by girls and boys and regular check on the prescribed dress codes specified in the prospectus.

#### Student Grievance Redressal Cell

The Student Grievance Redressal Cell aims at strengthening the teacher - student relationship and instills confidence in students. The cell takes care of the student requirements, happenings in the class, addressing problematic issues without delay, inculcation of human values and maintaining qualitative social ambience in the premises. Each unit has a committee which reports to the Integrated Grievance Cell. Most of the grievances are sorted out in an informal manner.

# Kalarava - Psychological Assessment and Counselling Center

Kalarava - Psychological Assessment and Counselling Center of Department of Psychology, Jain University offers psychological counselling for those in need & extends services and expertise to the general public. The center also help postgraduate students of second year psychology to get a practical exposure on their areas of specialization such as counselling, therapy etc. The center offers play area therapy, life

skills counselling, abuse counselling, rational emotional behavior theory, art therapy, corporate counselling etc. The play therapy area is the special feature of 'Kalarava'. Through special games, toys and finger puppets, the play therapy helps children below the age of 12 to deal with their emotions such as self- disclosure, expression and various interpersonal and intrapersonal relations.

# Assistantships, Fellowships, Student Insurance

Assistantships, Fellowships, Student Insurance and many such schemes are available to Jain University students.

Academic Resource Group (ARG) provides counseling to the student's fraternity on case to case basis. It is generally, done on one to one basis either with the students or the parents.

The ARG also supports the students for paid internship activities and part time jobs depending on the case requirement. The staff and students of the management program have been given the accident insurance benefit.

#### **Equal Opportunities Cell**

The main problems faced by people viewed as disabled, or with disabilities, or of minority status, or stems from disabling environmental, economic and cultural barriers. Disability and minority are therefore issues of equal rights on par with other forms of unjustifiable discrimination and prejudices. The Equal Opportunity Cell addresses the concerns of the students belonging to SC, ST, OBC and persons with disabilities (PWD). As part of its mission statement, the EOC ensures the following:

Affirmative and inclusive actions

- concerning SC, ST and OBC
- A barrier-free access to all buildings of Colleges, Departments, Libraries, Hostels and Offices of the University
- No discrimination on grounds of disability or minority status
- Reaching out to like-minded institutes and organizations dealing with similar issues
- Special learning measures in the library for people with disabilities

Information and Computer-Technology enablement aims at developing basic skills in communication and information through the use of computers mainly for those with visual impairment.

The programs on Disability and Human Rights help in understanding the experiences of students and staff with disabilities. It is designed to bring about the issues that affect the way in which people with disability are treated, locally as well as globally.

Jain University encourages differently-abled students to take up the programs offered by the University. They are given preference in the use of facilities like lifts, canteens, cafeteria and library. They are also allowed to record lectures in the class rooms. Visually impaired students are provided with software "George" to enable them to download material.

#### E-Library

E-Library is a comprehensive collection of content of books (non-book materials), periodicals / project reports / research articles / hand books / manuals / new letters etc. The key benefits of our e-library are:

#### **Training and Placement Cell**

The Training and Placement Cell of Jain University prepares the students to face the professional world and develop appropriate skill sets and work ethics. The cell allocates the best placement opportunities and guides the students in making the right career choice. Placement is ensured for eligible students. The primary objective of the placement cell at Jain University is to contribute to nation building by moulding students as corporate citizens. The training and placement cell works closely with the industry interface cell to create employment opportunities for emerging courses. The average placement for the past five years has been 93%. The highest CTC for PG has been INR 10.9 lakhs and for UG INR 16 lakhs per annum.

#### **University-Industry Interface Cell**

This cell has been created keeping in mind the ever changing industry landscape. The cell works with various Schools of the University to bridge the gap between theory and applied learning. It also facilitates the design of courses in collaboration with industries and professional bodies. The cell also supports the Student Career Advisory and Placement Support Team (SCAPS) for various activities. It also facilitates research, consultancy projects and various faculty development programs for the University. Some of the major activities of the cell are aimed at strengthening the academic and research activities, attracting collaboration &

tie-ups to develop new age courses and set up innovative labs, to interact with industry for skill development, career enhancement, intrapreneurship and entrepreneurial development for students.

Better interaction between technical institutions and industry is the need of the hour. This will have great bearing on the engineering curriculum, exposure of industrial atmosphere to engineering students and subsequent placement of young graduating engineers in industries across the country. With the advent of globalization and opening up of Indian economy to outside world, competition among industries have become stiff. To solve their engineering problems, now they look up to Engineering Institutions. Similarly, there is an urgent need to prepare engineering students for jobs in multinational companies by exposing them to newer technologies and engineering methodologies. ### **General Rules for Discipline**

#### **Discipline**

Misuse or damage to University property or facilities will lead to disciplinary action which could result in termination of a student's studies and / or payment for damages and call out charges. Breach of discipline can range from a failure to comply with any statute, ordinance, regulation or rule prescribed for the conduct.

#### Security

Personal property is the responsibility of the individual. The University will not accept any responsibility for items lost or stolen. Items lost or found should however be intimated at the facilities management desk.

#### Ragging

#### What constitutes Ragging?

- (a) Any disorderly conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling any other student with rudeness
- (b) Indulging in rouge / gangsters or indiscipline activities which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological or physical harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student
- (c) Asking the students to do any act or perform something, which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment that adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student
- (d) Teasing, embarrassing, humiliating, assaulting or using criminal force or

criminal intimidation, wrongful restraining, confining, causing grievous hurt, kidnapping, extortion, molesting, committing unnatural offences, causing death or abetting suicide

#### **Prohibition of Ragging**

- (a) Ragging within the University campus including its institutions / departments and hostels is strictly prohibited
- (b) Ragging in any form is also prohibited in the private lodges / buildings where these University students are staying
- (c) No person including students / staff / faculty shall participate or abet propagate ragging in any form

#### **Punitive action by the Administration**

Ragging is a cognizable offence under the law and the punishments meted out have to be exemplary and justifiably harsh to act as a deterrent. It may include

- (a) Cancellation of admission, suspension, rustication or expulsion from the University / hostel
- (b) Expulsion from the institution, and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period

#### **Attendance Requirements**

- (a) Undergraduate Program (other than Engineering)
- A student is eligible to appear for the semester-end examinations, only if he / she has put in a minimum of 75%

- attendance in each subject individually.
- No candidate is permitted to take the end-semester examination if he / she does not fulfill the attendance requirement.
- If a student is absent from all the classes without prior permission his / her name will be removed from the rolls of the University.
- (b) Undergraduate (Engineering)
  Program
- A student should have attended a minimum of 85% of the classes conducted in each subject. In case student fails to fulfill the 85% attendance requirement, then the Dean / Director can consider condonation to a maximum extent of 10% provided the candidate has a minimum of 75% attendance in that semester.
- No candidate is permitted to take the end-semester examination if he / she does not fulfill the attendance requirement.
- If a student is absent from all the classes without prior permission his / her name will be removed from the rolls of the University.
- (c) Postgraduate Programs
- A student should have attended a minimum of 85% of the classes conducted in each subject. In case student fails to fulfill the 85% attendance requirement, then the Dean / Director of Center can consider condonation to a maximum extent of 10% provided the candidate has a minimum of 75% attendance in that semester.

- No candidate is permitted to take the end-semester examination if he / she does not fulfill the attendance requirement.
- If a student is absent from all the classes without prior permission his / her name will be removed from the rolls of the University.

The above requirements may strictly be adhered to.

The students failing to comply with attendance requirements shall be required to seek re-admission into the same semester by paying the stipulated fees.
