


Figure 1.1 Poster of the event – Page 1



progressive muscle relaxation

One of the body's reactions to fear and anxiety is muscle tension. This can result in feeling "tense", or can lead to muscle aches and pains, as well as leaving some people feeling exhausted. Think about how you respond to anxiety. Do you "tense up" when you're feeling anxious? Muscle relaxation can be particularly helpful in cases where anxiety is especially associated to muscle tension. This information sheet will guide you through a common form of relaxation designed to reduce muscle tension.

Muscle tension

Muscle tension is commonly associated with stress, anxiety and fear as part of a process that helps our bodies prepare for potentially dangerous situations. Even though some of those situations may not actually be dangerous, our bodies respond in the same way. Sometimes we don't even notice how our muscles become tense, but perhaps you clench your teeth slightly so your jaw feels tight, or maybe your shoulders become. Muscle tension can also be associated with backaches and tension headaches.

Progressive Muscle Relaxation

One method of reducing muscle tension that people have found helpful is through a technique called Progressive Muscle Relaxation (PMR). In progressive muscle relaxation exercises, you tense up particular muscles and then relax them, and then you practise this technique consistently.

preparing for relaxation

When you are beginning to practice progressive muscle relaxation exercises keep in mind the folloing points.

- Physical injuries. If you have any injuries, or a history of physical problems that may cause muscle pain, always consult your doctor before you start.
- Select your surroundings. Minimise the distraction to your five senses. Such as turning off the TV and radio, and using soft lighting.
- Make yourself comfortable. Use a chair that comfortably seats your body, including your head.
 Wear loose clothing, and take off your shoes.
- Internal mechanics. Avoid practicing after big, heavy meals, and do not practice after consuming any intoxicants, such as alcohol.

general procedure

- I Once you've set aside the time and place for relaxation, slow down your breathing and give yourself permission to relax.
- 2 When you are ready to begin, tense the muscle group described. Make sure you can feel the tension, but not so much that you feel a great deal of pain. Keep the muscle tensed for approximately 5 seconds.
- 3 Relax the muscles and keep it relaxed for approximately 10 seconds. It may be helpful to say something like "Relax" as you relax the muscle.
- 4 When you have finished the relaxation procedure, remain seated for a few moments allowing yourself to become alert.

Relaxation sequence

- Right hand and forearm. Make a fist with your right hand
- Right upper arm. Bring your right forearm up to your shoulder to "make a muscle".
- 3. Left hand and forearm.
- 4. Left upper arm.
- Forehead. Raise your eyebrows as high as they will go, as though you were surprised by something.
- 6. Eyes and cheeks. Squeeze your eyes tight shut.
- Mouth and jaw. Open your mouth as wide as you can, as you might when you're yawning.
- Neck. !!! Be careful as you tense these muscles. Face forward and then pull your head back slowly, as though you are looking up to the ceiling.
- Shoulders. Tense the muscles in your shoulders as you bring your shoulders up towards your ears.
- Shoulder blades/Back. Push your shoulder blades back, trying to almost touch them together, so that your chest is pushed forward.
- Chest and stomach. Breathe in deeply, filling up your lungs and chest with air.
- 12. Hips and buttocks. Squeeze your buttock muscles
- 13. Right upper leg. Tighten your right thigh.
- Right lower leg. !!! Do this slowly and carefully to avoid cramps. Pull your toes towards you to stretch the calf muscle.
- Right foot. Curl your toes downwards.
- 16. Left upper leg. Repeat as for right upper leg.
- 17. Left lower leg. Repeat as for right lower leg.
- 18. Left foot. Repeat as for right foot.

Practice means progress. Only through practice can you become more aware of your muscles, how they respond with tension, and how you can relax them. Training your body to respond differently to stress is like any training – practising consistently is the key.




Figure 2.2 Participants performing different yoga poses




Figure 4.2 Ms. Annie George addressing the participants on market experiences

Brief Report of the Event:

In a week, close to 45 students actively registered using the link that was forwarded. Other than the students, the participants ranged from scholars to professors to parents who have taken a break from work and academics.

As decided by the faculty of the department, each of them handled one of the most relevant topic in today's scenario and had also planned activities as well as materials for all the participants.

The day 1

The day one had three sessions planned up.

The first session was taken by Ms.Manasa Raman, who spoke on the topic of "Parenting children with gadget addiction". The talk focused on discussing the ways to eliminate the conditions that could lead to the addiction of gadgets by kids. The talk had a presentation and in the end the parents were given the chance to clarify their doubts. The second talk was given by




Figure 5.2 Dr. Manasa addressing the participants on parenting children with gadget addiction




Figure 7.1 Participants of the event




Figure 7.3 Speaker Ms. Kannika P started the session




Figure 8.1 Participants & Speaker of the session




Figure 9.2 Speaker Ms. Priyanka TS in the event






Figure 9.3 Display of the presentation by the speaker




Figure 9.4 Participants of the event






Figure 9.5 Participants of the event




Figure 9.7 Participants performing the exercises




Figure 9.8 Mr. Ramesh Srinivasan briefing the students on the topic

Dr. Sudesh N.T (Asst.Professor of Psychology, Christ Deemed to be University, Bangalore) and Dr. Subasree Vanamali (Head of the Psychology Department, Madras School of Social Work, Chennai).

Brief Report of the Event:

"The abilities for adaptive and positive behavior is in need of revisiting in this pandemic to get inhibited with the new normal."

With this thought taken into consideration Jain University School of Psychology in collaboration with Indian Association of Life Skills Education hosted an Online National Webinar on the topic "LIFE SKILLS FOR THE NEW NORMAL" on 28th August 2021. The event went on for 3 hours from 2:00pm to 5:00pm. With the help of Mrs Uma Shreedhar and Dr Alka Ranjan, both faculties from the department of Psychology, an insightful session was made possible with young and aspiring participants. The resource persons who graced us with their presence were Dr. Sudesh N.T (Asst.Professor of Psychology, Christ Deemed to be University, Bangalore) and Dr. Subasree Vanamali (Head of the Psychology Department, Madras School of Social Work, Chennai).



The event was further divided into two parts:

Session One on the topic "Adapting to the New Normal-Life Skills in Practice" graced by Dr. Sudesh N.T. Dr Vanamali was introduced to the audience by Sadaf Amreen, where she told about Dr Sudesh N.T's accomplishments. Dr. Sudhesh N.T. is currently working as an Assistant Professor of Psychology in CHRIST University as Assistant Professor in higher education for the past seven years. He has published one book as Editor, Under Sage publications with the title "Character Strength Development" and published thirteen articles in national and international journals. He has also published chapters in three edited books. Along with that he has twelve years of experience in life skills and soft skills training, corporate training and community intervention programmes. He has worked as a supportive supervisor in GFATM7 (Global Fund for AIDS, Tuberculosis & Malaria) project for 3 years under MG University, Kerala, funded by UNESCO. He is also working with a Major research project as co-investigator and currently holding the position as joint-secretary of IALSE (Indian Association of Life Skills Education) and coordinator of Project Spandan – life skills training and psycho-social rehabilitation of HIV infected adolescents.

The session was started with an activity by Dr.Sudesh where he sent through a poll link in order to understand the mental state of the participants. He justified the fact that today at this time of pandemic majority of us have started feeling neutral that was unlikely to happen at the start of it which justifies the fact we have got adopted to the new normal. With that said he spoke about the three important life skills important at this point of time that are: Response, Resilience and Recovery while putting stress on the aspect of unlearning and learning behavior. How we respond to a situation is under our jurisdiction of emotions, how we mend ourselves in an elastic manner to stand tough so that nothing can break us beyond our capacity, how after every deterioration you tend to make a comeback with a much stronger self this time. Every individual had a different experience in a pandemic, people who stayed far away from family were glad enough that they were coming back home while others were scared for the wellbeing of their nears and dears. Everything inhibited by the environment was everyone's very first experience; a pandemic, an uncertain situation, an online education setup and so on. Out of all these situations what impacted the mental health of individuals more was the fake news with regard to pandemic situations, few there didn't put up any thought process and kept on forwarding the fake news which proved out



to have negative effect on few while life threatening on others. In such a situation there is a need to acquire three core life skill components that are compliment, supplement and reinforce which require other components like critical thinking, creative thinking, self-awareness, decision making,problem solving, effective communication, interpersonal relationship, empathy, coping with emotion and coping with stress. With the question "Why, When and How should these skills be incorporated in our life?" is the context we were left with to ponder upon.

Session Second on the topic "Thriving in The New Normal:Life Skills for Positive Mental Health" graced by the presence of Dr. SubashreeVanamali. Dr Vanamali was introduced to the audience by Kamala Meenakshi Iyer, where she told about Dr Vanamali's accomplishments. Dr ShubashreeVanamali is Head of the Department in the department of Psychology at the Madras school of social work located in Chennai. She holds a PhD in Psychology. She is the recipient of many prestigious awards namely Dr APJ Abdul Kalam excellence award in 2021 for mental health promotion, Barbara Fredrickson award for positive psychology and well-being from the Red Barn, Greatest value at tough times award by NMV University. Ma'am started with an insight on the troubles everyone was having during the pandemic and how people were coping with all these problems. She then went on to explain Psychological well-being and all its six parts. All of these were discussed in great detail. She then opened the floor by asking the participants about what they thought mental health workers are and what they are supposed to do, to which Mrs Alka Ranjan shared her experiences of working as an helpline worker during the lockdown and how mental health was considered a taboo by the general public to this day. Dr Vanamali then talked about the New Theory of well being and its 5 essential parts. She then talked about the growth mindset and how it is important to embrace the growth mindset to succeed and live happier in the future. For this she gave the example of Bhakti Sharma, who was a swimmer from Rajasthan. She talked about how she overcame all adversities and went on to become one of the youngest swimmers to cross the English Channel, and swim all the 4 oceans of the world.

The CARE model was explained by Ma'am next. The 4 parts of CARE, C-connect, A-adapt, R-routine and E-exercise were discussed in great detail. Maam then went on to talk about how life skills can be adapted for the well-being of the society.






Figure 13.1 Ms. Neha Dubey, a Licensed Clinical Psychologist, Apollo Gleneagles Hospital, Kolkata addressing on World Alzheimer's Day




Figure 13.2 Poster of the event






Figure 14.2 Speaker Mr. Aditya Rajan in the event with presentation






Figure 16.1 Participants of the event




Figure 16.2 Speaker of the event






Figure 16.3 Interaction of the speaker with participants




Figure 17.3 Inaugural session






Figure 17.4 Speaker Ms. Bhaswati Ramanujam started the session




Figure 17.5 Participants of the event

This was an online workshop that was conducted on zoom portal, with a total of 28participants who had different educational backgrounds. The workshop started with an introduction from Dr. PoojaRai followed by an introduction of the speaker Ms. IlaKulshreshta by Ms. Aditi after which Ms. Smrithi introduced Ms. Saanya. Ms. Ila gave a clear understanding of what the entire community is all about and how sensitive ye important it is to accept identities and use the right pronouns. They understood that indeed identity gives you a sense of freedom and confidence. The entire workshop was very affirming. She created a space where we could openly talk about our confusions about the community, without being judged. There was a lot of interaction and a clear understanding of the community was given to us. We started with the basics, the spectrum itself and what LGBTQIA+ (lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, intersex, asexual) stands for Gender is a social construct. It is us the same humans who make lives terrible for some other humans. Ms. Ila said "I can experience myself as I am" and I will carry this for the rest of my life.



They had an activity where they were given a scenario of raising a child without knowing the biological sex of the baby. We have set definitions of gender, especially and only of the binary. The second half of the workshop focused on discussing three case studies, that helped the participants understand about various concerns of the LGBTQIA+ community and theapproaches to follow when dealing with such clients.




Figure 18.1 Ila Kulshrstha, Licensed Clinical Psychologist, Art based therapist,

Brief Report of the Event:

The International Conference on Healthy Ageing being held on 10th-11th March 2022 by PG Psychology, School of Sciences, Jain (Deemed-to-be) University in collaboration with Vayomanasa Sanjeevani had invited Dr. Nilamadhab Kar MBBS, MD, DPM, DNB, MRCPsych, Consultant Psychiatrist and College Tutor, Black Country Healthcare, NHS Foundation Trust Wolverhampton, UK, Honorary Professor, Sri Sri University, India.

Dr. Kar spoke about the Care Pathways to Support Healthy Ageing by comparing the Indian and UK context, how healthy ageing comprises understanding, promoting, supporting and taking healthy ageing further. He started with the Indian aspects and went on to talk about the aspects of healthy ageing in the context of the UK.



Dr. Kar initially spoke about how India's socio economic situation affects healthy ageing. He highlighted the lack of health care facilities in villages and the lack of age friendly infrastructure. He spoke about problems such as immobility and financial dependency and how they affect the older adults. He also stressed on the lack of knowledge about who to contact when there is a health emergency, which hospital to go to, hospitals nearby and how these factors effect older adults, especially those living alone.

He later went on to talk about misdiagnoses, irregular medical checkups and lack of diagnosis regarding depression and association memory impairments to old age as other problems faced by older adults. He also highlighted elder abuse, usually by a family member and the increasing likelihood of abuse when one is disabled. He then stressed on the importance of physical and social activities in the elderly.


Regarding the UK, he spoke about general physicians, councils, nurses, social services, nursing and old age homes and how they affect the wellbeing of the elderly. He highlighted the importance of clinics, hospitals, crisis teams, arranging care for the elderly in the physical, mental and social health of the older adults. Dr. Kar talked about initiatives in the UK such as respite care, palliative care, dosette boxes, meals on wheels and support groups in promoting and supporting healthy ageing.

Dr. Kar then spoke about the NHS, their contributions for older adults by giving guidelines for healthy ageing and a new initiative about the care for frail people. He highlighted the contributions of the Royal College of Psychiatrists in helping the elderly by publishing various books that assist and support them in healthy ageing. He then talked about the Care Quality Commission in England that monitors the care being provided everywhere in England.

He concluded his talk by highlighting the importance of life skills for living alone, mental well being in individuals, creating the right opportunities for the elderly as the duty of the community and providing the basic needs, taking complaints of carers and the elderly seriously as the responsibility of the authorities.

Everybody can experience healthy ageing. This conference organised by the department of psychology is very important for the benefit of society; the various sessions emphasise the various pathways to support healthy ageing.




Figure 20.1 Mr Ranganath Mohapatra lecturing to the students

Brief Report of the Event:

The training workshop on Dance Movement Therapy focuses on an in-depth practical approach as well as the basic theoretical approaches. Participants do not have to be skilled dancers or have prior training in any dance form. The workshop helps individuals facilitate the movement of bodies, which in turn enables therapeutic and healing benefits. Dance movement therapy is an amalgamation of various movement-based activities like body moves, group coordination, and body coordination.



Activity 1: Using a movement metaphor or prop (dupatta /scarf was used) that helps physically and expressively demonstrate a therapeutic challenge. The facilitator presented props to incorporate movement and music was played. Stages of movement work. Seeding, exploration, expression, resolution & integration was focused on.

Activity 2: Music & movement Balloon Dance Materials: Balloon for each participant Music Large open space Instructions:

- a) Each of the participants needs to blow the balloon and need to take that balloon. The facilitator played one piece of music and encourage each participant to try to keep their balloons from touching the ground using their heads, hands, and shoulders. Mind-body connection was focused.
- b) Protecting their own balloon and at the same time bursting others' balloons. It was helpful in demonstrating how people get attached to certain objects or people and try to protect their emotional attachment.

Activity 3: Cards activity

45 cards were placed on the table. Each card had different pictures like a rainbow, butterfly heart, flower etc. The participants were instructed to pick one card each depending on which kind of card they are most relating to at that moment. All of the participants were randomly divided into groups of five. Within the group, each participant was instructed to share the reason why they picked that card and shared a factual or fictional story about that card. So this activity helps them in understanding their own emotional state facilitated by the card.

All of the participants were instructed to form a story with a beginning and an end based on all the cards. Participants were also asked to prepare a demonstration of that story. It helped the participant to creatively express themselves and develop group coordination.

Activity 4: Reflection- cool down

Here the facilitator asked the participant to be in that moment and not to interact with others and be mindful of that present situation.

After the activity and techniques were discussed and demonstrated theoretical perspective was explained by the resource person.




Figure 26.3 Speaker Dr. Shruthi U started the session






Figure 26.4 Speaker Dr. Shruthi U describing the topic






Figure 27.1 Participants of the event






Figure 27.2 Speaker addressing the participants on the topic




Figure 27.3 Presentation by the speaker




Figure 28.1 Welcome & Inaugural session of the event




Figure 30.1 Participants of the event




Figure 31.1 Email Communication




Figure 31.2 Revert mail from the speaker






Figure 31.4 Guest lecture on "Strat-up Vs Corporate Entrepreneurship", speaker explain on the similarities the challenges of A Start-up and Corporate Entrepreneurship, held on 6th September 2021 (Batch and Event: 2020-22; Programme: III Semester EFBM)




Figure 32.1 Email Communication of the event






Figure 32.2 Revert mail from the speaker




Figure 32.3 Guest lecture on "Understanding Human Behavior and Introduction to Team Work", industry practitioner provided insights into basic aspects of human behavior held on "8 Sep 2021" (Batch and Event: 2020-22; III Semester, BA, MF, LSCM, SOM




Figure 33.1 Email communication of the event




Figure 33.3 Mr. Nirmal Vijay interacting about the concepts of Attitudes and Personality with the 1st semester Batch 2021-2023 in the online and offline mode




Figure 34.2 Speaker and students during the session




Figure 39.1 Email communication of the event




Figure 37.1 Email Communication




Figure 37.4 Mr. Naga Siddharth interacting about the concepts of Motivation and its importance with the 1st semester Batch 2021-2023 in the online and offline mode.




Figure 38.1 Email Communication of the event






Figure 38.2 Guest lecture on role of HR during strategy shift




Figure 39.1 Email Communication of the event




Figure 40.1 Guest Lecture by Mr. Kothuri Venkat Dinesh in Online mode for online students




Figure 40.2 Guest Lecture by Mr. Kothuri Venkat Dinesh in Online mode for online students




Figure 41.2 Guest lecture Mr. Rajkumar Srivastava (industry practitioner) provided insights on Negotiation on "28 Sep 2021" (Batch and Event: 2020-22; III Semester online and offline Block-2 MSE students




Figure 41.3 Guest lecture Mr. Rajkumar Srivastava (industry practitioner) provided insights on Collaboration on "28 Sep 2021" (Batch and Event: 2020-22; III Semester online and offline Block-2 MSE students.




Figure 42.3 Dr Uma Warrier welcoming Mr Aravind Warrier




Figure 42.4 Nikitha Soni introducing Aravind Warrier






Figure 42.5 Aravind warrier conducting the guest session




Figure 43.1 Email Communication of the event




Figure 43.2 Aishwarya introducing the speaker Karthik VPB






Figure 43.3 Industry practitioner conducting the session




Figure 44.1 Email Communication of the event






Figure 44.2 Response mail from the speaker




Figure 44.3 Guest lecture on "TOPIC", speaker explain on Workforce Diversity, held on"




Figure 45.2 Industry professional Giri Krishnan staring the session




Figure 45.3 Industry expert Giri Krishnan explaining Job evaluation using an illustration




Figure 45.4 Industry expert Giri Krishnan demonstrating CTC calculation using excel sheet




Figure 46.1 Email Communication of the event




Figure 46.2 Email Communication of the event




Figure 46.5 Guest lecture on "TOPIC", speaker explain on Motivational theories application in today's world, held on October 21, 2021" (Batch and Event: 2021-23; Programme: I Semester MBA – Section A & H




Figure 47.1 Email Communication of the event






Figure 47.2 Email Communication of the event




Figure 48.1 Email Communication of the event




Figure 48.2 Speaker Dr. Joseph George & presentation by the speaker






Figure 48.3 Speaker interaction with participants & the co-ordinator of the event




Figure 48.4 Student participation in the event & the slides display




Figure 49.1 Email communication of the event




Figure 50.2 Mr. Rajkumar Srivastava, Marketing Director Nutrasurgitech interacting with faculty and students on 26th October 2021 (Batch and Event: 2020-22; III Semester Block-3 MSE students OF CF and FHRM)




Figure 50.3 Mr. Rajkumar Srivastava, Marketing Director Nutrasurgitech delivering lecture and presenting his insights with students on 26th October 2021 (Batch and Event: 2020-22; III Semester Block-3 MSE students OF CF and FHRM)






Figure 50.4 Mr. Rajkumar Srivastava, Marketing Director Nutrasurgitech interacting and answering queries of students on 26th October 2021 (Batch and Event: 2020-22; III Semester Block-3 MSE students OF CF and FHRM)




Figure 51.1 Email communication of the event




Figure 51.2 Guest lecture on "Understanding Human Behavior and Introduction to Team Work", industry practitioner provided insights into basic aspects of human behavior held on "27 Oct 2021" (Batch and Event: 2020-22; III Semester, CF, FHR)




Figure 51.3 Guest lecture on "Team work and issues in dealing with teams", industry practitioner provided insights into basic aspects of team development held on "27 Oct 2021" (Batch and Event: 2020-22; III Semester, CF, FHR)




Figure 52.1 Email communication of the event




Figure 52.2 Guest Lecture Session by Mr. Jeeva in progress




Figure 53.1 Poster of the event






Figure 53.2 Participants of the event






Figure 53.3 Participants of the event




Figure 54.2 Speaker of the event


Figure 55.2 Invitation through Email communication – image 2




Figure 56.1 Email Communication




Figure 59.1 Email Communication






Figure 60.2 Participants gathering the event

Session Objectives:

To help students understand the relevance of communication in teams and also to highlight the stakeholders role in it. The session is conducted to engage the students in building the right teams for the right results.

Summary & Key learning from Session:

The following points were deliberated and hence the key learnings from the session are noted in detail.

- 1. Success Equation for Project Management is
- 2. Success can be achieved with good team skills, competencies, and a positive attitude.
 - **Introduction to project** -how it has become an integral part of modern business, quality management, and it should be useful for the end user. A project should start with why and then move towards answering how and what to do.
 - **Stakeholders**-a person or group who impacts development of project or takes active stake.
 - **Classification of stakeholders** as internal (team members, functional manager, top management) and external stakeholders (clients etc).
 - The **need to identify stakeholders**-reasoned their higher interest, involvement, and level of influence affects the project. Their requirements should be considered for its successful completion.
 - Analysing the stakeholders-how? Degree of influence, level of knowledge, intensity of
 expectation, their roles in project, department associated with project also should know
 who are in sync with your interest and who will have conflicting views.
 - **Management of stakeholder**-by providing solution to identified problems as well as unidentified problems, understanding your capabilities whether they are syncing with project expectations and assessing the environment (internal and external). In addition project manager must know expertise of each stakeholder, information about them,



their business strategies and models as communication changes accordingly, behaviour pattern, stakeholder mission.

- Asked students about the **mission statement** of CMS B school.
- Success of a project is based on two-way dependencies at different levels like project team vs project leader, functional vs general administration, top management vs key stakeholder, customers vs vendors- should have feedback mechanism to manage their dependencies, regulatory body vs supporting organisations.
- **Stakeholder matrix elements**-name of stakeholder, position in organization, location and role in project, contact details, preferred mode of communication and time for faster response. Have clarity on non-negotiables from stakeholder's side, and their key expectations to manage them as they will not compromise with these so better to ask before.
- **Communication methods**-project MIS to provide real time status of project to all stakeholders, increase accessibility at different time zones by web-based info solution, maintain record of events what changes you made, who gave permission etc for review and audit of project, documentation for action plan should include insights, observations, periodical reports with real time information, focus on agenda of communication.
- **Means of communication**-one on one vs group, physical vs electronic, formal vs informal for visibility of project.
- **Intra team communication**-within team members can use formal and informal mode.
- **Contract types** in project
 - Fixed price contract
 - Time and material
 - Cost reimbursable
- **Earned Value Management**-cost, performance, schedule as dimensions.
- Steps in EVM-
- define activity with clarity of budget, resources needed
- Create schedules for each activity(what need to be completed by what time) and resources(who will do what)
- Develop times phased budget(how much budget for a month based on activity)
- Actual cost of each activity



- Calculate variance-budget variance, schedule variance(deviation based on planned and actual cost), cost variance.
- Calculate budget at completion, budget cost of work schedule, budget cost of work performed, actual cost of work complete.
- **EV calculation** with example.
 - **Rules**-50/50 rule,0/100 rule, % completion rule ;Should give real time accurate data for EVM calculation.
- Asked the difference between skill and competency, Gave examples of competencies like perseverance.
- **Building Project Team-** Steps
 - o Deeper understanding of project scope and needs
 - Required competencies to meet needs(multiple competencies)
 - Time availability
 - o Engage with candidates
 - Approval from reporting managers
 - Support from Top management
- Once a team is created, give clarity on non-negotiables-trust surplus, seamlessness, integrity, measurable outcome, agreement on public and personal level, contribution to group benefit, willingness to seek and offer support, purpose and objective of the project.
- Why do teams fail-reason can be ambiguity in purpose/mission of project, roles and
 deliverables, metrics to measure the success of project. Lack of- motivation, clarity on
 activity, how to manage risk, inadequate intra and inter team communication, guidance
 from leader etc.
- **Building a winning team**-by giving clarity and deliverables to each member, identify early adopters, SOP for roadblocks and conflicts, know each member's strength, encourage collaboration internally (to increase productivity)and externally(for innovations) and frequent brainstorming. Reward team on 4 parameter-seamlessness, time sense, creativity, innovation
- Leadership- consist of 4 interdependent skills
 - Cognitive
 - o Technical
 - Communication
 - Emotional and interpersonal skills.



- In addition to this negotiation skills, risk mitigation, problem solving are required.
- Leadership communications differ with situation(vertical, horizontal. diagonal), style (personality of leader, maturity of follower, environment needs)
- Softwares for PM
- Ending with the importance of communication and success formula-"focus on what is needed and nothing else".




Figure 61.4 Participants, Co-ordinators, Speaker of the event




Figure 62.2 Email Communication




Figure 62.3 A still from a short video showcasing effective communication




Figure 62.4 Mr. Namish Gupta presenting on persuasive messages






Figure 62.5 The industry expert sharing the process of writing




Figure 62.6 Students from Sec B, Sem 1 on 8^{th} Sept 2021 attending the industry expert session by Namish Gupta






Figure 62.7 Students from Sec B, Sem 1 on 8^{th} Sept 2021 attending the industry expert session by Namish Gupta




Figure 62.8 Students participating in an activity 'Harvard Case Method' to test effective communication skills as administered by the industry expert






Figure 62.9 Students participating in an activity 'Harvard Case Method' to test effective communication skills as administered by the industry expert




Figure 63.2 Email Communication





Figure 63.3 A still from a short video showcasing effective communication








Figure 63.5 The industry expert sharing the process of writing




Figure 63.7 Students from Sec B, Sem 1 on 8^{th} Sept 2021 attending the industry expert session by Namish Gupta




Figure 63.8 Students participating in an activity 'Harvard Case Method' to test effective communication skills as administered by the industry expert






Figure 63.9 Students participating in an activity 'Harvard Case Method' to test effective communication skills as administered by the industry expert

To help students understand the relevance of communication in teams and also to highlight the stakeholders role in it. The session is conducted to engage the students in building the right teams for the right results.

Summary & Key learning from Session: The following points were deliberated and hence the key learnings from the session are noted in detail.

- ✓ Success Equation for Project Management is
 - o Success can be achieved with good team skills, competencies, and a positive attitude.
- ✓ **Introduction to project** -how it has become an integral part of modern business, quality management, and it should be useful for the end user. A project should start with why and then move towards answering how and what to do.
- ✓ **Stakeholders**-a person or group who impacts development of project or takes active stake.
- ✓ **Classification of stakeholders** as internal (team members, functional manager, top management) and external stakeholders (clients etc.).
- ✓ The **need to identify stakeholders**-reasoned their higher interest, involvement, and level of influence affects the project. Their requirements should be considered for its successful completion.
- ✓ **Analysing the stakeholders-how?** Degree of influence, level of knowledge, intensity of expectation, their roles in project, department associated with project also should know who are in sync with your interest and who will have conflicting views.
- ✓ **Management of stakeholder**-by providing solution to identified problems as well as unidentified problems, understanding your capabilities whether they are syncing with project expectations and assessing the environment (internal and external). In addition,



project manager must know expertise of each stakeholder, information about them, their business strategies and models as communication changes accordingly, behaviour pattern, stakeholder mission.

- ✓ Asked students about the **mission statement** of CMS B school.
- ✓ Success of a project is based on two way **dependencies** at different levels like project team vs project leader, functional vs general administration, top management vs key stakeholder, customer's vs vendors- should have feedback mechanism to manage their dependencies, regulatory body vs supporting organisations.
- ✓ **Stakeholder matrix elements**-name of stakeholder, position in organization, location and role in project, contact details, preferred mode of communication and time for faster response. Have clarity on non-negotiables from stakeholder's side, and their key expectations to manage them as they will not compromise with these so better to ask before.
- ✓ **Communication methods**-project MIS to provide real time status of project to all stakeholders, increase accessibility at different time zones by web based info solution, maintain record of events what changes you made, who gave permission etc for review and audit of project, documentation for action plan should include insights, observations, periodical reports with real time information, focus on agenda of communication.
- ✓ Means of communication-one on one vs group, physical vs electronic, formal vs informal for visibility of project.
- ✓ **Intra team communication**-within team members can use formal and informal mode.
- ✓ **Contract types** in project
- ✓ Fixed price contract
- ✓ Time and material
- ✓ Cost reimbursable
- ✓ **Earned Value Management**-cost, performance, schedule as dimensions.
- ✓ Steps in EVM-
- ✓ define activity with clarity of budget, resources needed
- ✓ Create schedules for each activity (what need to be completed by what time) and resources (who will do what)
- ✓ Develop times phased budget (how much budget for a month based on activity)
- ✓ Actual cost of each activity
- ✓ Calculate variance-budget variance, schedule variance (deviation based on planned and actual cost), cost variance.



- ✓ Calculate budget at completion, budget cost of work schedule, budget cost of work performed, actual cost of work complete.
- ✓ EV calculation with example.
 - **Rules**-50/50 rule,0/100 rule, % completion rule; Should give real time accurate data for EVM calculation.
- ✓ Asked the difference between skill and competency, Gave examples of competencies like perseverance.
- ✓ Building Project Team- Steps
 - o Deeper understanding of project scope and needs
 - Required competencies to meet needs (multiple competencies)
 - o Time availability
 - o Engage with candidates
 - Approval from reporting managers
 - Support from Top management
- ✓ Once a team is created, give clarity on non-negotiables-trust surplus, seamlessness, integrity, measurable outcome, agreement on public and personal level, contribution to group benefit, willingness to seek and offer support, purpose and objective of the project.
- ✓ Why do teams fail-reason can be ambiguity in purpose/mission of project, roles and
 deliverables, metrics to measure the success of project. Lack of- motivation, clarity on
 activity, how to manage risk, inadequate intra and inter team communication, guidance
 from leader etc.
- ✓ **Building a winning team**-by giving clarity and deliverables to each member, identify early adopters, SOP for roadblocks and conflicts, know each member's strength, encourage collaboration internally (to increase productivity) and externally (for innovations) and frequent brainstorming. Reward team on 4 parameter-seamlessness, time sense, creativity, innovation
- ✓ **Leadership** consist of 4 interdependent skills
 - Cognitive
 - Technical
 - Communication
 - Emotional and interpersonal skills.
- ✓ In addition to this negotiation skills, risk mitigation, problem solving are required.



- ✓ **Leadership communications** differ with situation (vertical, horizontal, diagonal), style (personality of leader, maturity of follower, environment needs)
- ✓ Softwares for PM
- ✓ Ending with the importance of communication and success formula-"focus on what is needed and nothing else".

Brief Report of the Event:

Karnataka. India Basavanna spread social awareness through his poetry, popularly known as Vachanas.

So long as we view Basava in the context of Veerashaivism, we miss his personality and his profound teaching. Though he was born in Karnataka, he belonged to the whole of mankind for his heart relented for the poor and downtrodden everywhere. He taught us one of the main principles of Democracy by saying that the roots of social life are embedded not in the cream of society but in the scum of society.

Theme of the Seminar:-

The seminar revolves around the movement of reformation inaugurated by Basava had its far reaching effect upon the social life of the nation. So long as we view Basava in the context of Veerashaivism, we miss his personality and his profound teaching. Though he was born in Karnataka, he belonged to the whole of mankind for his heart relented for the poor and owntrodden everywhere. He taught us one of the main principles of Democracy by saying that the roots of social life are embedded not in the cream of society but in the scum of society. It is his witty saying that the cow does not give milk to him who sits on its back but it gives milk to him who squats at its feet. With this wide sympathy, he admitted high and low alike into his fold. This remarkable admission carried its influence far and wide and stirred the stagnant waters of the land. The caste system is the negation of democratic society.

But the Anubhav Mantapa established by Basava laid down the foundation of social democracy. A democratic society is one in which all enjoy social rights and privileges without any barriers of class distinctions. Birth, wealth, caste or creed do not determine the status of man. This means faith in the dignity of man and the belief that a common man is as good a part of society as a man of status. Basava believed that man becomes great, not by his birth but by his worth to the society.

Day -1

The seminar started with the invocation by performing arts students of JAIN (Deemed -to-be University). Selected Vachanas of Basaveshwara were selected for Invocation.

Dr.Rajani Jairam, Prof. Dept of Sanskrit, Dean(student Welfare), JAIN (Deemed-to-be University) delivered the welcome and inaugural address.



The gathering was address by the Chief Guest Dr. Basavaraj Kalgudi renowned Kannada Scholar. He explained the terms Vachana – giving a word, Kudalasangamadeva – lit. meaning to unite, an idea of oneness to build harmony in the society. Presenting from the Vachana sahitya of Basavanna and his followers he expressed their idea in vachanas. The political situation during the time of Basavanna, the revolutionary thoughts of Basavanna and its relevance. Thus it was an insighfult talk about the purpose, context and relevance of Basavanna.

The inaugural session was presided by Dr. Sreekala Nair, Director, International School of Sree Sankara Studies, Joint Secretary, Indian Philosophical Congress. Quoting many Philosophers, 3she conclude her talk with more emphasis on Basaveshwara's ideology.

Dr. Sudhir Singh Rajput- University of Delhi and Dr. Asha Rajiv- Director, School of Sciences, JAIN (Deemed-to-be University) were present for the inaugural session. The inaugural session was concluded with Vote of thanks by Dr. Geetha Madhusudan, Professor and Head, Dept. of Sanskrit. She thanked the management, ICPR and members, the chief guest and the entire organizing team including the students. This was followed by a tea -break.

Expert talk:

It started with the expert talks. Dr. Asha Devi, renowned Kannada Scholar gave information about the literary importance of Vachana Sahitya and Women Vanachankras. Dr. Sheela Devi Malimath, renowned scholar in the field of vachana sahitya presented many vachanas and expressed the essence of the vachana sahitya.

Technical sessions:

Three technical sessions were scheduled. Prof. Vasanth Kumar was the chairperson for session first session. Dr. Vijaykumar, Smt. Rajeshwari, Dr. Hemalatha and Dr. Venkobarao presented their papers. In their presentations they spoke about Basavanna and Vishvakalyana. This was followed by the lunch break.

The third session chaired by Dr. B.V Rajaram. Dr. Manjunatha Palya Dr. Hemanth, Dr. Sabu Thomas expressed their thoughts being derived from Vachana sahitya. Dr. Sabu Thomas presented political perspectives co-relating with Basavanna.

Day -2

Day 2 started with the expert talk on Seminar theme by Dr. Sudhir Singh Rajput, University of Delhi. He addressed the gathering and gave more insights about the political and socio-cultural aspects of our country. He spoke about pre-colonial colonial and post-colonial political scenarios and its influence on society. He brought the parallels of Basaveshwara's philosophy and main principles of Democracy by saying that the roots of social life are embedded not in the scum of society. This was followed by further technical sessions. Mr. Ramachandra N U, Dr. Roopa G, Dr. Yashaswini presented papers in the first technical session of Day 2. This was chaired by Dr. Sheeladevi Malimath. The presentations included discussions on management skills.

Management is a multidisciplinary function which is harmonized and integrated mutually with varied disciplines. In the next session (expert talk) Dr. B.V Rajaram – renowned director and eminent theatre personality, addressed the gathering. He spoke about Anubhava mantapa and the king Bijjala. He gave more information about the Dramas relating to Basavanna. Basavanna being the prime minister to King Bijjala who ruled from 1157 to 1167 over Kalyana, a city of historic importance, as a great prophet the combination of rare qualities was explained by him. He spoke about the mystic temperament, an idealist choice, being statesman by profession etc.



The last technical session was chaired by Dr. Vatsala. Dr. Natesha L, Sri. Hoysaladitya, Dr. Mekhala presented their view points in this session. Dr. Natesha. L spoke about the terminologies of Basavas teachings relating to Sanskrit grammar. Dr. Mekhala spoke about Anubhava Mantapa the ability of Shiva sharanes – Women as shiva sharane, their ability and courage. The technical sessions presided by the panelists, were concluded with their remarks.

Thus, the entire program of two days with many expert talks and different dimensions of Basavanna brought various perspectives and its contemporary relevance.




Figure 68.2 Online session (T G Shenoy) in process

Brief Report of the Event:

The Karvaan Club of Hindi Department, School of Sciences, Jain (deemed-to-be) University, Bangalore and Bharat VikasParishad had jointly organized a National Hindi Webinar Series from 6th to 11th December 2021. The topic of the Webinar series was 'Indian Freedom Fighters'. The first day of the webinar series was on 6th December 2021 with the freedom fighter being 'Subhas Chandra Bose'. The Chief Guest Speaker of the webinar was Prof. Dr. Suresh Chandra Gupta from Farrukhabad, Uttar Pradesh. Sir has a teaching experience of 39 years. He is the former President of Bharat VikasParishad and presently the managing editor of GyanPrabha. The webinar commenced with Ganesh Vandana and SarswatiVandana followed by Classical Dance. Then a short introductory video of Subhas Chandra Bose was shown which included key highlights of his life journey. Then the guest speaker was called upon to talk about Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose. Subhas Chandra Bose was born on January 23, 1897 in Cuttack, Orissa. His father was Janaki Nath Bose and his mother was Prabhavati Devi. Bose was a brilliant student right from the childhood. He topped the matriculation examination of Calcutta province and graduated with a First Class in Philosophy from the Scottish



Churches College in Calcutta. To fulfill his parents' wishes he went to England in 1919 to compete for Indian Civil Services, appeared for the Indian Civil Service competitive examination in 1920, and came out fourth in order of merit. However, he left his Civil Services apprenticeship midway to return to India in 1921. He joined the Indian National Congress under the influence of Mahatma Gandhi. Subhas also announced the formation of the Independence League. Subhas Chandra Bose was jailed during Civil Disobedience movement in 1930 and released in 1931. Defying the ban on his entry to India imposed after his release on medical grounds; Subash Chandra Bose returned to India and was again arrested and jailed for a year. He was elected the President of Congress twice in 1938 and 1939, and due to much opposition to his rigid stand, he resigned from the post of president and formed a progressive group known as the Forward Block. When he was put under house arrest in Calcutta, in January 1941, Subhas Chandra Bose disappeared from his home in Calcutta under a disguise and reached Germany via Afghanistan. In July 1943, he arrived in Singapore from Germany and organized the Azad Hind Fauj (Indian National Army). Subhas Chandra Bose was reportedly killed in an air crash over Taipeh, Taiwan (Formosa) on August 18, 1945. Though it is widely believed that he was still alive after the air crash not much information could be found about him. Then the participants asked few questions to the guest speaker which were satisfactorily answered. The guest speaker was then felicitated with a token of appreciation. The webinar ended with vote of thanks and National Anthem. All the participants enjoyed and gained lots of insight on Subhas Chandra Bose and his contribution to India's Independence.

The webinar began with Ganesh Vandana and Saraswati Vandana. Later on, was followed by Classical Dance. The chief guest was called upon by Dr. Rakhi K Shah Ma'am who is the HOD of Hindi Department to talk about 'Madan Lal Dhingra'. Madan Lal Dhingra was born on 18 February 1883 in Amritsar, India, in an educated and affluent Punjabi family. His father, Dr.Ditta Mal Dhingra, was a civil surgeon, and Madan Lal was one of eight children (seven sons and one daughter). All seven sons, including Dhingra, studied abroad. Dhingra studied at Amritsar in MB Intermediate College until 1900. He then went to Lahore to study at the Government College University. Here, he was influenced by the incipient nationalist movement, which at that time was about seeking Home Rule rather than independence. Dhingra was especially troubled by the poverty of India. He studied the literature concerning the causes of Indian poverty and famines extensively and felt that the key issues in seeking solutions to these problems lay in Swaraj and Swadeshi. Dhingra embraced with particular fervor the Swadeshi movement, which was about encouraging Indian industry and entrepreneurship while boycotting British goods. In 1904, as a student in the Master of Arts



program, Dhingra led a student protest against the principal's order to have the college blazer made of cloth imported from Britain. He was expelled from the college for this. His family was seriously worried about him, and his elder brother, Dr. Bihari Lal, compelled him to go to Britain to continue his higher education. Dhingra finally agreed, and in 1906, he departed for Britain to enroll at University College, London, to study mechanical engineering. While studying in university, he assassinated William Hutt Curzon Wyllie, a British official. these actions of his subjected him to death on 17 August 1909. Later on, the participants asked a few questions to the guest speaker which were satisfactorily answered. The webinar was continued by the song which was sung by Stutee from BcGBT 1st Sem. The guest speaker was then felicitated with a token of appreciation. The webinar ended with a vote of thanks and the National Anthem. All the participants were cooperative during the session, they have definitely gained a lot from the speaker as well as Madan Lal Dhingra. On 08.12.2021, Wednesday at11:00 am. We had Chief Guest Sri. Ramesh Chand Jain, Andhra Pradesh. The webinar commenced with Ganesh Vandana and SaraswatiVandana. Rakhi ma'am, the Head Of Department if Hindi was called up for introducing our guest of honour Sri. Ramesh Chand Jain, currently The National Chairman of Environmental Projects.

He is remarkable person. Sir, joined Bharat VikasParishad in 1989 as "Karyakarta" and later served as Branch President, State Convener for NGSC, State Convener for Vanvasi Kalyan Yojana, State treasurer for Andhra Pradesh, State President for Andhra Pradesh, Zonal Organising Secretary Zone 15, Zonal Chairman Zone 15 and National Additional Secretary General Of South [7 states]. He conducted National group songs competition at Visakhapatnam at National level under the designation of State President of Andhra Pradesh in which 1000 students across India participated.Ramesh sir was also nominated as Telecom Advisory Board Member for Visakhapatnam district by the Ministry of TeleCommunications Central Government. He is currently a President for Jeeva Raksha Sangham at Visakhapatnam, Executive member for Consumer Protection Council, Visakhapatnam and also for Papa Home[Police department, Public street children welfare home]. He also has been a member of the Animal Welfare Board, visakhapatnam. Then the guest speaker, Ramesh Jain sir was called upon to talk about "Alluri Sitaram Raju". Sir started with the introduction of Alluri Sitaram Raju followed with key highlights of his journey and his contribution to the country. Alluri Sitaram Raju was born on 4 July 1897 in Pandurangi village, Visakhapatnam, Andhra Pradesh. He belonged to the Kshatriya family. His mother's name was Suryanarayanamma and his father's name was Vectoram Raju. He was soon deprived of his father's love. Sitaram Raju's father died at a young age, due to which he could not get the proper education.



Later, he came to live with his family in Tuni. From here he had twice departed for pilgrimage. He was one of the brave revolutionary martyrs who sacrificed their lives for the independence of India. He had very little formal education. He became attracted to spirituality by contact with his relatives and became a monk at the age of 18.At that time the number of Sitaram Raju's soldiers was small, yet a military officer named 'Gorati' tied Sitaram Raju to a tree and fired at him. Even after the sacrifice of Alluri Sitaram Raju, the British government did not get freedom from rebel campaigns. In this way, this brave soldier, who slew the British power for almost two years, became a martyr. Ramesh Jain ended his speech by saying "There is beauty and power in unity. We must be united in heart and mind. One world, one people."

The Karvaan Club of Hindi department, School of Sciences, Jain (deemed to be University), Bangalore and Bharat Vikas Parishad had jointly organized a national Hindi Web series from 6th to 11th December 2021. The topic of the webinar series was 'Indian freedom fighters'. The fourth day of the webinar series was on 9/12/21 with Freedom Fighter being Khudiram Bose and Baji Rout. The chief guest speaker of the webinar was Shri Sachendra Panda from Bhubaneswar, Odisha .The webinar commenced with Ganesh Vandana and then SaraswatiVandana. Then the guest speaker was called upon to talk about Khudiram Bose and Baji Rout. Khudiram Bose was born on December 3, 1889 in a kayastha family in a small village Mohalbani in the Medipur district of Bengal his father was Trailokyanath Bose and mother was Lakshmipriya Devi. He was the four children in a family of three daughters. He was 6 years old when his parents died. At the age of 16 Khudiram took part in planting bombs near the police station and targeted government officials. When his friend Sunil Kumar got punished harshly for an incident they decided to kill the Kingsford judge. He was sentenced to death at the age of 18 and finally rest in peace on 11 August 1908 at his last words were "VandeMataram, VandeMataram ". Then the speaker started talking about the life of Baji Rout. Baji Rout was the youngest Indian sanathani freedom fighter and martyr having been killed at the age of 12 He was born on 5 October 1926. Rout was a boat boy who was shot by British police when he refused to ferry them across the Brahmani River. On the night of 11 October 1938 at Nilakanthapur chat, Bhuban, Dhenanal district. Then the participants are asked a few questions to the guest speaker which was satisfactorily answered. Then the guest speaker was felicitated with a token of appreciation. The webinar ended with a vote of thanks and national anthem all the participants enjoyed and gained lots of insight on these freedom fighters heroic stories.

The Chief Guest Speaker of the webinar was Prof. Dr. Tribhuvan Sharma from Bikaner, Rajasthan. Prof.Dr. Tribhuvan Sharma Joined BVP IN 1992.Sir is presently the National Additional Secretary General. Sir haD previously worked as PST in branch And Prant. Also is National convenor NGSC ,National Secretary NGSC and as the Vice Chairman NGSC.

Bhagat Singh was a very great person. What were his thoughts? His thoughts were to have an independent India. We all know the importance of independent India. Today our country has its freedom. Even after 75 years of freedom, are we having a country which Bhagat Singh had thought of? We have to make a country which Bhagat Singh had thought of only then we will be able to give him homage. He lived for 23 years. He was born on 28 September 1907 and died on 23 March 1931. In 1928, when Lala Lajpat Rai died in a Lathi charge protest, Bhagat Singh questioned that if we are having a very peaceful protest then why are we having a Lathi charge on us. After this he kept on hiding. In an assembly he threw a bomb and later got himself arrested. He has done many protests. He has written many literature books but even today people think that he was towards communism. He was an editor and writer too. Reading his writing we get to know that he was not towards communism instead he treated everyone as equal. Even before he was hanged to death, he said to one of the workers in jail to get food from his home. This incident shows us that he treated everyone equally. He was an inspiration in the 20th century because at that time he was the one who started the independence protests.

Also gave a slogan "Inquilab zindabad" which means that my protest of independence should go for long. His parents Sardar Kishan Singh Sandhuand and Vidyavati wanted their son Bhagat Singh to lead a normal life. Bhagat Singh threw the bomb in the assembly to spread his message of independence not to harm anyone in the assembly. He could destroy the whole assembly and kill many people in the assembly but he didn't do so as his main motive was not to kill people instead just to send his message to everyone. He had an enquiry on himself in the court. He was sentenced to death. There were many people who could help him get out of this situation but he didn't want to do so. According to him, his life was nothing before India's independence. According to him his death was one of the ways for India to get its independence. He changed the mindset of people towards



nationalism. According to him nationalism is something where every person gets food, shelter and freedom to live. He never fought for his own cultural freedom but for the nation. He dedicated his life to the country.

Then the participants asked a few questions to the guest speaker which were satisfactorily answered. The guest speaker was then felicitated with a token of appreciation. The webinar ended with a vote of thanks and National Anthem. All the participants enjoyed and gained lots of insight on Bhagat Singh and his contribution to India's Independence.

The Karavan Club of Hindi Department, School of Sciences, Jain(deemed-to-be) University, Bangalore and Bharat Vikas Parishad had jointly organised a National Hindi Webinar Series from 6th to 11th December 2021. The topic of the Webinar series was 'Indian Freedom Fighters'. Thakur Kesari Singh Barhath (21 November 1872 – 14 August 1941) was an Indian revolutionary <u>leader</u>, freedom fighter, and educationist from <u>Rajasthan</u>, India. He was the head/patriarch of the Barhath family, members of which actively participated in anti-British activities including KunwarPratap Singh Barhath (his son) and Zorawar Singh Barhath (his brother). Kesari Singh was at the top of the list among the revolutionaries to be monitored by the British CID. He is also known dissuading Maharana Fateh Singh from attending the 1903 Delhi Durbar through his <u>Dingal(Rajasthani)</u> work 'ChetawaniraChungatiya'. He was the founder of 'Veer Bharat Sabha', a revolutionary organisation based in Rajasthan. He also co-founded 'Rajasthan Seva Sangh' and ' Rajputana-Madhya Bharat Sabha'. He wrote extensively on the theme of nationalism and independence, and also composed poems in Dingal(Old Rajasthani). Later on, one of the participants asked a question to the guest speaker which was satisfactorily answered. The webinar was continued by a 3 minute documentary on the life of Thakur Kesari Singh Barhath. The guest speaker was then felicitated with a token of appreciation. The webinar ended with a vote of thanks and the National Anthem. All the participants were cooperative during the session, they have definitely gained a lot from the speaker as well as Thakur Kesari Singh Barhath.




Figure 69.4 Speaker of the event




Figure 70.1 Dr. Ruby Varghese addressing the participants



Speaker Profile:

Dr Shannon Olsson:

Dr. Shannon Olsson heads the Naturalist-Inspired Chemical Ecology (NICE) group at The National Centre for Biological Sciences (NCBS) in Bangalore. The NICE Group strives to learn how animals, especially insects, make decisions in nature. Their work traverses Himalayan meadows, ecologically sustainable agriculture in Coorg, and pollution in Bangalore – anywhere insects are important, which is nearly everywhere on Earth. Dr. Olsson completed her Ph.D. in Neurobiology and Behaviour from Cornell University, and a postdoc from the University of California, Los Angeles, she moved to the Max Planck Institute of Chemical Ecology in Germany where she collaborated with engineers to develop an artificial chemical communication system based on insects. In 2014 she moved her lab to NCBS in India to apply chemical ecology to preserve the biodiversity and ecosystems of the country. Courage and communication have been the key to her success, despite being an outsider in many contexts.

Mr. Mohan Prakash

Mr. Prakash is a Ph.D. Scholar from Gyeongsang National University, South Korea. He has also worked as an Assistant Professor in the Department of biotechnology in Jaya college of arts and science, Chennai, Tamilnadu.

He has also been recipient of several awards including "Young scientist award" from Gyeongsang national university. Best paper presentation award from international conference on jellyfish toxins in Busan, South Korea, "Best oral presenter" in national conference at Boston College of professional



studies, Gwalior, Madhya Pradesh and have won many "Best poster and paper presentation awards" in inter collegiate competition, held in various colleges in Chennai.

Then Dr. Mohan Prakasah who has done a great amount of research in jellyfish toxicology and enlightened the audience about zebrafish becoming increasingly important to scientific research and how valuable it is as a model organism for studying human genetics and diseases. 


Figure 71.2 Dr. Shannon Olsson addressing the participants about how insects and their pollination activity are crucial for agrarian based countries like India




Figure 72.1 Dr. P. Sankaran addressing the participants






Figure 72.2 Poster of the event




Figure 74.2 Poster of the event






Figure 76.1 Ms. Jayati Mishra addressing the participants about Department forum-Crestas




Figure 77.2 Speaker in the session




Figure 77.3 Speaker describing the topic with presentation






Figure 77.4 Q&A Session in the event




Figure 77.6 Valedictory session of the event




Figure 78.1 Dr Kiran Kumari interacting with participants on significance of forensic science




Figure 79.2 Dr. Kalavathy introducing the Guest Speaker.




Figure 80.1 Email communication of the event




Figure 80.2 Introduction to agile projects




Figure 80.3 Quiz conducted and leader board displayed






Figure 80.4 Quiz results




Figure 81.1 Guest lecture on "TOPIC", speaker explain on Structure & Challenges in Distribution, held online" (Batch and Event: 2020-22; Programme: 11/09/2021, III Semester LSCM(online & offline)




Figure 81.2 Guest lecture on "TOPIC", Q&A, , held online" (Batch and Event: 2020-22; Programme: 11/09/2021, III Semester LSCM(online offline)




Figure 82.1 Email communication of the event




Figure 83.1 Email communication of the event




Figure 83.5 The business practitioner matching concept to practice in the e-commerce framework.




Figure 84.1 Email Communication of the event




Figure 84.2 Guest Lecture – Timeline of Accounts and Finance by CA Bhavya Parvathi – Date: 14.09.2021 – FRSA Course (2021 Batch Event) for Sections B, F, I (Offline) and M (Online)




Figure 84.4 Guest Lecture – Timeline of Accounts and Finance by CA Bhavya Parvathi – Date: 14.09.2021 – FRSA Course (2021 Batch Event) for Sections B, F, I (Offline) and M (Online)




Figure 85.1 Email communication of the event




Figure 85.3 Student, Devika Jain presenting solution to the case study provided by Practitioner Ms. Monica M. Date: 13.09.2021 – Wealth Management Course (2020 Batch Event) for MF and FHRM (Online).




Figure 85.4 Prof. Khan gives her comments to the case analysis by students in Practitioner Ms. Monica M. Date: 13.09.2021 – Wealth Management Course (2020 Batch Event) for MF and FHRM (Online).






Figure 85.5 Practitioner Ms. Monica Malkani explaining the objectives of the case study. Date: 13.09.2021 – Wealth Management Course (2020 Batch Event) for MF and FHRM (Online).




Figure 85.7 Practitioner Ms. Monica Malkani explaining case study solution and detailed calculations in the financial plan. Date: 13.09.2021 – Wealth Management Course (2020 Batch Event) for MF and FHRM (Online).




Figure 85.8 Google classroom announcement




Figure 86.1 Email communication of the event




Figure 86.2 Guest Lecture by Mr. Amaresh K S in Online mode for offline students




Figure 87.1 Mr. Munawar Ahmed addressing the MBA-Aviation students on Zoom.




Figure 89.1 Mrs. Uma addressing the participants on Fraud examination




Figure 89.2 Poster of the event

Brief Report of the Event:

On being a part of Crime Investigation and Research work under the supervision and guidance of Mr. S. Sujayaraj, Asst. Prof., assisted by Ms. Monica Simon, Dept. of Forensic science along with a team of students had an opportunity to explore the importance of Wildlife Forensic Science under wildlife crime investigation. Submission of the consent forms from the respective parents, identification proof followed by Covid-19 negative report and vaccinated report were mandatory to participate in the workshop prior to departure. A night journey between 5 to 6 hours from Bengalooru to Yellapur via Hubli and an onward car journey for an hour took our team members to the Forest training centre at Tattihalla on 22nd September, 2021. On reaching the destination, we were welcomed by the Range Forest Officer (RFO) and their subordinates. Accommodations were allocated separately for boys and girls with all required facilities. It was a good opportunity to meet an enthusiastic IFS Officer, The director of that particular range, who shared his knowledge and experience regarding wildlife crime investigation at the training centre. The first session of the workshop started at 18:00 Hrs on 22nd September, 2021, with the power point presentation by Mr. S. Sujayaraj, consisted history of Forensic Science and other key insights regarding the importance of collection, packaging and preserving the evidence at the crime scene. The visualization of a latent finger print impression developed using alternative light sources, a demonstration of developing latent fingerprints on a



beverage bottle using fluorescent powder and UV light was demonstrated followed by the latent foot and shoe impression (Gait pattern on non porous surface) were also observed using oblique.

Second day of the workshop begun after the breakfast with two separate teams compromised with professional and honor students under the supervision of Mr. S.Sujayaraj, assisted by Ms. Monica Simon. 'A' team included students from 2nd year B.Sc Forensic Science assisted in a simulated outdoor crime scene of a murder case (human) in the forest area, explaining the importance of documentation of the crime scene along with the search patterns. Team 'B', from 3rd year students were provided an opportunity to assist in demonstrating macroscopic examination and microscopic examination of trace evidence. Task on developing and recording of fingerprints and collection of latent fingerprints was also demonstrated.

Prior to the departure from the training center closing session of the work shop ended with discussion of those challenging cases experienced by the officers. Vote of thanks from an officer was followed by high tea with snacks (Bajji). We were appreciated with applause of overwhelming joy from those officers who learned about the importance of wildlife forensic science. The team departed from the Forest Training Centre in forest department vehicles around 17:00 hrs and reached Dharwad.

Since our travelling train departure was at 11pm, Sujay sir had arranged accommodation (two rooms, separately for boys and girls) at Indraprastha for having dinner and getting comfort, to relax before reaching the Railway Station at Dharawad. Departed from Dharwad reached Bengalooru at early hours on 24th September, 2021.

Outcome of the workshop we experienced the professional exchange communication with the agency involved in the wildlife forensic science, crime scene investigation. This work shop motivated our enthusiasm along with confidence of the field work to prove our ability with efficiency by applying scientific methods and the required skills. We thank the department of Forensic Science and the management of Jain (Deemed to be University) for giving us an opportunity to explore and participate in the Wildlife forensics workshop.

We are grateful to S.Sujayaraj sir for providing an opportunity to explore our knowledge in the field of Wildlife forensic science especially in crime scene investigation. He has made us to realize the impact of the team work communication skills and thought to enrich and enlighten the knowledge to provide the justice to the innocent victim (Animal and Human) under the process of crime scene investigation.




Figure 90.2 Poster of the event




Figure 93.2 Miss Deepali Chaudhary addressing the candidates via zoom




Figure 94.1 Email communication of the event




Figure 94.2 Dr.Prabhakaran, Senior Divisional Manager in The New India Assurance addressing the students




Figure 96.1 Email communication of the event




Figure 97.1 Guest lecture on "TOPIC", speaker explain on Supply Chain Analytics Software" (Batch and Event: 2020-22; Programme: III Semester LSCM(ONLINE and OFFLINE)-30.9.21




Figure 98.2 Speaker Mr. Vishwanadh Raju in the event




Figure 98.3 Presentation by the speaker






Figure 98.4 Speaker describing the topic with presentation




Figure 98.5 Speaker describing examples relevant to the topic






Figure 98.6 Interaction of the Speaker




Figure 98.7 Participants interacting with the speaker




Figure 99.1 Poster of the event




Figure 99.2 Speaker Mr. Satish Kumar Dwibhashi in the event




Figure 99.3 Speaker describing the topic with presentation






Figure 99.4 Interaction of the Speaker with the participants




Figure 100.1 Poster of the event






Figure 100.2 Students during the session




Figure 102.2 Lean manufacturing industry Practioner Lecture




Figure 103.1 Email communication of the event




Figure 103.2 Speaker of the event




Figure 103.3 Speaker with participants in the event




Figure 104.1 Poster of the event

He is Chair Member in National Cyber Security and Safety Standards of India, an active member of International Cyber Threat and Task Force (ICTTF), Technical Sr. Cyber Crime & Forensic Advisor and Investigator to various Law enforcement agencies in India and Kenya and the editorial technical committee member in Digital 4N6 journal.

The topics covered were:

Cybercrime categories

The cybercrime categories are based on against person, against property, against nation and many more. In against person was mentioned about the online harassment and cyber stalking mainly targeted on women, identity theft which can steal someone's personal details such as social media passwords and bank details. When coming to property people does financial crimes via using unauthorized websites or fake details and overtake customers details and making illegal fraud transfers. Last against a nation which is a high threatening security to nation which is equal to terrorist activities especially damaging critical information infrastructures which can be related to



a criminal cases, abiding government startup properties or even leaking the contact details of the higher authorities such as ministers, diplomat officers, court judges, reputed businessmen or breaching security details of border nation which is responsible by security forces are all leads to the cyber terrorism.

Types of cyber crime

- •Email frauds Email frauds are increasing day by day which makes people click by viewing exciting offers like giving attractive offers from fake websites or creating a replica of original reputed websites, offering low interest loans, or any other reputed dating websites. And government is promoting and giving awareness to the society to take of such frauds
- •Hacking When a person steals a data or a source from a third party without his/her knowledge is hacking. This happens when a person shares a password with knowing or without knowing to the other person it can be anything such as mobile pattern or passcode, or any social media platform or it can be online bank passwords to access the money, so to avoid such cases people should be aware about their knowledge what all they are suppose and not supposed to share other people.
- •Malware In every individual person's system or laptop has the virus or any other malware which damages their system in a complete demolition. This can happen through the ransom spam link which has virus content by just clicking, even by inserting a pen drive containing a virus can also damage the whole system. This can be reduced by fixing high security softwares like antivirus softwares and many more.
- •Cyber terrorism- This is a high threatening security to nation which is a terrorist activities especially damaging critical information infrastructures which can be related to a criminal cases, abiding government startup properties or even leaking the contact details of the higher authorities such as ministers, diplomat officers, court judges, reputed businessmen or hacking the high confidential details which relates to the government policies or breaching security details of border nation which is responsible by security forces are all leads to the cyber terrorism.
- •Online cyber trafficking In the days especially during the nationwide lockdown online has been the biggest hub for the people to find something new and people try to learn dark web crimesonline such as drug trafficking- exporting those stuffs to another package and adding with e-commerce transportation and even in the online wildlife trade which exports an illegal animals or plants parts which can be historical or imitated once.



- •Crypto currency crimes- At the current scenario the world is behind the crypto currencies where they invent money in the bitcoins or doggie coins which can make ten times double the money where people use to sale the fake websites to prompt the crypto-currencies, but they invest in the fake websites and their details have also been hacked from it.
- •Online and social media crime- The online harassment and cyber stalking mainly targeted on women, identity theft which can steal someone's personal details such as social media passwords and bank details. In such cases people offer or release the job ads which attract the people to fall into it and let them to pay some amount of money as registration fee etc.
- •Mobile crime- Nowadays we use to get fraud calls that we have won a jackpot worth some money, and they ask the details to share the contact no, bank details etc. So, in such cases people share their details even if this can be called or can be sent through via SMS or any via mode.
- •Online financial frauds- When we purchase anything through e-commerce or any platform, we share the details of the credit/debit card number which can authenticate the third person without our source and even by sharing online bank details, internet banking fraud where they ask unnecessary to share the details of the bank accounts and the transactions.
- •Information theft- Stealing someone's information without their concern especially with highly reputed people's details or the personal details are hacked to defame them, privacy violation or by impersonation and identity theft for the purpose of money or any other revenge against that person has been taken.

Goals of a cyber attack

- •Getting money, power, control, publicity, revenge
- •Crackers, learning, strategic operation, embed sleepers, espionage/ sabotage

In ransomware attacks, cybercriminals steal or encrypt an organization's information and demand a ransom. If the organisation refuses to pay attackers threaten to publicly release or permanently delete the data, which forces the organisation to choose between settling a large ransom or bearing the large scale reputational and financial loss

The estimated cost of ransomware to business will top \$20 billion in the upcoming year with an average attack costing over \$4 million



Business email compromise (BEC) is one of the most financially damaging crimes. It exploits the most oorganizations rely on emails to conduct business

Brand Abuse

These attacks include impersonation on social media, job scams, next of kin scams, investment scams, fake news, and even to launch malware

Supply chain attack

They are cyber-attacks that compromise a target organisation by penetrating a third party vendor of a software package instead of the organisation itself.

The biggest supply chain attack of 2020 was the SolarWinds where attackers pushed malicious code as part of an update package of the Orion software.

Attacks on RDP /VPN

Many companies have been implementing Remote Desktop Protocol (RDP) and Virtual Private Network(VPN) to allow access to cooperate data and servers off-site.

Cybercriminals view VPN as an open gateway into an organization's entire network if the access is achievable

Data Exposure on Code repositories

Developers use code repositories such as GitHub, to backup, share and mange changes to code.

They forget to remove sensitive data from their code or make the repositories private before uploading them on GitHub. Malicious hackers actively scan and scrap GitHub for leaked passwords, client IDs, secret keys and API tokens, to name a few, because they know programmers are prone to such oversight

Targeted threats leveraging remote work

Employees working from home use devices that aren't patched, managed or secured by corporate IT department. This gives hackers an entry point into the network that bypasses the perimeter security. Sensitive company data is being stored on those devices, further increasing the risk of data breaches.



Phishing, Vishing and Smishing attacks

Since it's outbreak in March 2020, COVID-19 has been the main headline of news and media outlets. Threat actors recognized the pandemic as the most apparent bait to make their schemes more effective. The use of the COVID-19 pandemic as a theme for phishing campaigns is expected to progress into 2021. Attacks will often coincide with significant events or news, spike in new cases or a new vaccine drug's announcement.

The lecturer spoke for an hour and then there was a Q&A session where the participants entered their questions in the chat box and the speaker answered all the questions patiently.




Figure 106.2 Guest lecture Mr Alok Verma (industry practitioner) provided insights on ERP System SAP modules on "16th November 2021" (Batch and Event: 2020-22; III Semester Offline and Online Block-4 SOM students.




Figure 108.1 Guest lecture on "Use of ERP and technology in Forecasting and applying SCOR attributes in dynamics of PPC", speaker explain on Forecasting and SCOR attributes" (Batch and Event: 2020-22; Programme: 17/11/2021, III Semester MHR offline)




Figure 109.1 Mr. Siddarth, Industry Guest




Figure 110.2 Email communication of the event




Figure 110.3 Guest lecture Mr GK Raju (industry practitioner) provided insights on ERP modules on "18th November 2021" (Batch and Event: 2020-22; III Semester Offline and Online Block-4 SOM students.




Figure 110.4 Guest lecture Mr GK Raju (industry practitioner) provided insights on ERP modules and ZOHO ERP on "19th November 2021" (Batch and Event: 2020-22; III Semester Offline and Online Block-4 SOM students




Figure 111.1 Ms. Kritika, Industry Guest




Figure 112.1 Email communication of the event




Figure 112.2 Mr. Arunachalam addressing the candidates via zoom




Figure 113.1 Email communication of the event




Figure 113.2 Guest Lecture by Mr. Karthik in Online mode for online students

Brief Report of the Event:

A team of 4 members had an opportunity to work under Mr. S. Sujayraj to explore the importance of wildlife experience by being a part of a workshop conducted on Importance of Crime Scene Investigation. Submission of Consent forms from the parents, identification proofs, Covid-19 negative certificate and Double dose vaccination certificate was mandatory to participate in the workshop. All the students and faculty was advised to take necessary Covid-19 precautions prior to departure to the workshop. We started our journey on the night of 24th November from Bangalore, after 5-6 hours of journey we reached Yellapur. We made our way into the Forest Training Centre in Tattihalliin a Tempo traveller. We were given a pleasant accommodation with all the facilities. After our morning breakfast we started our work by setting up different activities for the trainees which included fingerprint kit, sniffing samples, microscope for hair analysis, and chart presentations. The session by Mr. S. Sujayraj, Assistant professor, Department of Forensic Science, Jain (deemed-to-be) University started around 4:30 with a power-point presentation which gave them a clear idea of History of Forensic Science, along with importance of proper evidence collection, and how to



preserve them. A set of activities was conducted like signature forgery, sniffing activity, and incorporation of UV light to detect fingerprint on surface caught their attention. Gait Pattern analysis of latent impression on non-porous surface was conducted to give the officers an idea of use of oblique lighting in Forensic Science. The session concluded with this note.

The second day session started in the early morning at 7:00 AM, where our group was divided into two consisting of two 2nd year Msc. Forensic Science students and two 1st year Msc. Forensic Science students each, where one team was assigned to explain the charts and different forensic equipment used to collect and preserve the evidence and was assisting Mr. S. Sujayraj in setting up a simulated outdoor crime scene, while the other team was explaining the microscopic and macroscopic examination of trace evidence, recording fingerprints and development and collection of latent fingerprints. After morning breakfast all the officers were taken to the reconstruct the simulated crime scene and the students had the opportunity to explain and communicate about the different aspects of crime scene investigation and evidence collection with the officers at the training centre. After both the sessions we packed our belongings and the equipment. After vote of thanks we departed from the Forest Training Centre in the evening to reach Dharwad Railway Station. We reached Bengaluru on the following day- 27th November 2021.

On 7th December, 2021

As soon as we reached the destination briefing was conducted by Sujaya Sir,our first task was to display the charts and to be updated for explaining if given an opportunity. We went around the area to find the place to set up the crime scene. As first day officers were busy, we arranged everything that was needed to workshop on second day.

On 8th December, 2021, We were briefed by our teacher, the workshop included PowerPoint presentation by our teacher, giving insights about forensic science to the officers. Later we divided the officers into two batches, one batch was taken to the stimulated crime scene and the other batch was doing and students were assigned to explain few things regarding - fingerprint analysis, basic microscopic examination of hair samples ,they were also shown basic equipment used in forensics. While presentation was going on, in between the officers were also given certain activities such as – Signature examination, sniffing, fingerprints analysis-There was also a small session conducted in the evening wherein lifting of latent fingerprints from a bottle surface using fluorescent powder, uses of UV and IR light sources in the field of forensic science was discussed with the officers. The activities also include Gait pattern analysis using oblique light.

Simulated primary and secondary crime scenes was created. The primary crime scene was an outdoor crime scene in the forest. The secondary crime scene was inside an abandoned van. Students were provided an opportunity to interact and explain the importance about blood spatters, various physical evidences, and their collection and preservation techniques.

In the open field line pattern of search method was implemented were the officers have to search for physical evidences that were planted by students.

Overall, it was a fantastic learning experience surrounded by curious minds with eagerness of learning for our future careers. Despite the fact that the Covid – 19 pandemic required us to adjust our study habits, this session was a bright spot in our learning journey. We acknowledge and express

Brief Report of the Event:

The workshop was scheduled from 9th december 2021 to 10th december 2021 for Trainees of Assistant Coservator of Forest at Karnataka Forest Academy, Gungaragatti, Dharwad District. Our workshop team reached the academy on 8th december 2021 late evening. The workshop team was divided into 2 subgroups, one assisting Mr. Sujayaraj S, PhD Scholar (wildlife forensic science), Asst. Professor, Jain (Deemed to be University), indoor with the presentation and interaction with trainee officers while the other headed by Ms. Ashwathi Vijayan, Asst. Professor, Jain (Deemed to be University), incharge of activitieswhich included setting up charts for display, setting up microscopes and equipment used for recording fingerprints and other various instruments used in



crime scene investigation. Two classrooms, one for powerpoint presentation, other for setting up instruments, an outdoor location amidst a canopy of trees for primary-simulated crime scene and an abandoned vehicle for secondary-simulated crime scene was used for thoeritical teaching, successful demostartion and hands on training of various methods of search patters, documentation, identification, collection and packaging of a variety of physical, trace and biological evidences.

On the 9th of december 2021, after the initial introductory session, The workshop started with the powerpoint presentation of Mr. Sujayaraj S, Asst. Professor, Jain (Deemed to be University), which included a brief history of Forensic science, survey and documentation of the crime scene along with collection and packaging methods for various types of evidences. Different types of wildlife crimes, along with injury patters and post-mortem changes were also discussed. The session was continued till late afternoon which included documentaries on wildlife crimes and elaborate discussion of case studies was done. The day came to end with a plethora of activities that included sniffing, gait pattern analysis, demonstration of usage of fluorescence powder to develop latent fingerprints and its visualisation under Ultra Violet light, to name a few.

The 2nd day of the workshop (10/12/2021) started out at 08.30 for the officers, though for our team, the work had started two and a half hours prior. We started with the simulated primary and secondary crime scenes, planting appropritate physical, trace and bioligical evidences, then we moved our way into the classrooms where the ink slabs were inked, microscopes with specimens focused, and instruments used in collection, preservation and packaging were kept for display. Initially the batch of officers were divided into two groups, one would accompany sujay sir to the primary and secondary crime scene, the other group was again divided into 3 batches, one was going to be involved with fingerprint recording, the other was to observe handwriting specimens and other microscopic slides while the 3rd batch was to view the charts and instruments that were displayed. On completion of their agendas, the batches moved in cyclical manner to the other two tasks. Once all the batches were donw with both the crime scenes, fingerprinting, and microscopic analysis, an interactive session was held, the officers shared their learnings from the workshop and also cases related to wildlife from their native states.

Once all the sessions were over, we were greeted with a pleseant surprise in the form of a visit by Director of Human Resources, Karnataka Forest Academy, Dr. Vijay Lal Meena, IFS. All the activities were repeated in his presence, where sir himself was practically demonstrating each and every activity.




Figure 117.1 Mr. Sujayaraj demonstrating evidence collection to forest officials

Brief Report of the Event:

The workshop was conducted from 10/01/2022 to 11/01/2022 at Karnataka Forest Academy, Gungaragatti, Dharwad District, Karnataka State. Mr. Sujayaraj S, Asst. Professor, Dept. of Forensic Science, Jain (deemed to be University) was invited as a resource person to conduct a guest lecture cum workshop on the importance of Forensic science. He was accompanied by Mr. Gagan and Karthik, persuing final year B.Sc., Forensic science in Jain University.

The main aim of the workshop was to impart forensic technique and methods that can be applied to wildlife crime scenes and wildlife crimes.

The preparation started on reaching the academy a survey was conducted in order to set up a simulated crime scene included other discussions on activities to be conducted relevant to the subject. A lecture hall to deliver lecture and bamboo groove with partial pasture covered along with the trees were choosen to prepare a simulated wildlife crime scene under the guidance of



Mr.S.Sujayaraj. Physical evidences like plastic packets, bottles, vials along with syringes and needles and trace evidences such as hair and fibre were planted.

The second day (11/01/2022) started with Sujay Sir's PowerPoint presentation which included a brief history of Forensic science, survey and documentation of the crime scene along with collection and packaging methods for various types of evidences. Different types of wildlife crimes, along with injury patters and post-mortem changes were also discussed. The theoretical session ended with an elaborated interaction and discussion of case studies where the officers were curious to share information about various cases making it a highly interactive session.

The latter part of our second day involved practical demonstration of the barricading, survey, search patterns, documentation, photography, sketching, collection and packaging of various physical evidences and trace evidences. This was spearheaded by Sujay sir where he demonstrated all of the above-mentioned aspects to the officers.

To provide the officers with hands on experience, the officers also had to follow search patterns to document the simulated crime scene, collect and pack the physical and trace evidences planted in the same. After finishing with the primary crime scene, we headed to the secondary crime scene where biological evidence such as pooling of blood, spatter patterns, satellite spatters along with trace evidence such as hair were planted. The officers were taught on how to collect various types of evidences in different physical states and how to package the same evidences before sending it to the Forensic Science Laboratories.

Under the guidance of Mr.Sujayaraj.S, we had an opportunity to demonstrate and explain the importance of collected physical evidences such as injection vials and syringes, latent prints were identified and developed using powder technique, the theory about fingerprints and how they are developed was explained by us, we also explained about collection of fingerprints from suspects using rolling method and printers ink on an FD-258 card along with the importance of fingerprints in identification of victims, perpetrators and in cases of mass disasters. We even developed latent prints on an egg using black powder to demonstrate latent prints can be developed on any non-porous/ semi-porous surfaces. The workshop was concluded with an explanation on various latest state of the art technologies and instruments being used in various branches of forensic science by Sujay sir.



The current pandemic situation has forced us to change our patterns and has affected immensely on the type and number of physical activities that could have been conducted, the workshop was as a whole was a very enriching, information dense, learning experience with utmost level of academic measure, this experience will be of great value for our future endeavours as well. 


Figure 121.1 Poster of the event




Figure 122.2 Speaker with participants of the event






Figure 122.3 Speaker describing the topic with presentation




Figure 123.1 Email communication of the event






Figure 123.2 Email communication of the event




Figure 123.3 Mr. NAVANEETH MALINGAN – Topic: Introduction to Python – 25/2/2022 – CF1, CF2, CF3 and IFA Sections






Figure 123.4 Mr. NAVANEETH MALINGAN – Topic: Introduction to Python – 25/2/2022 – CF1, CF2, CF3 and IFA Sections




Figure 123.5 Mr. NAVANEETH MALINGAN – Topic: Introduction to Python – 25/2/2022 – CF1, CF2, CF3 and IFA Sections

He explained what each of the columns of the extracted data indicate and what are the differences between some of the terms which were in the column headings. He explained when the bullish and bearish instances occur. He explained this by considering the support and resistance lines basis, comparison of current price with average highs and average lows, comparison of current prices with the past close prices and such other strategies and to identify the signals as to when the market is bullish and bearish.




Figure 127.1 Email communication of the event




Figure 127.2 Guest lecture on "Application of Data Analysis before Investing" – Guest speaker Mr. Sagar U S interacting with students held on 25th March, 2022 (Batch: 2020-22; IV Semester; Sec: BFAS AND IFA




Figure 128.4 Brochure of the event






Figure 129.1 Poster of the event






Figure 129.2 Participants joining the meet




Figure 130.2 Students during the session.




Figure 131.2 Participants & Speaker of the event




Figure 132.1 Email communication of the event




Figure 134.1 Speaker & participants of the event

Dr. Kumar Krishen, Senior Scientist, Johnson Space Center, NASA visited the School of Sciences campus to deliver a lecture on Technology Needs & Innovations for Space Exploration.

Speaker Profile:

Dr. Krishen is listed in Who is Who in the World, Who is Who in America, Who is Who in Science and Technology, Men of Achievement, Personalities of America, and 2000 Outstanding People of the 20th Century and was commissioned "Honorary Texan" by Texas Governor Rick Perry in 2001. Dr. Krishen is the recipient of many awards and honours from universities, industry, and NASA including the NASA Exceptional Service Medal. Dr. Krishen was nominated by Governor George W. Bush and confirmed by the State Senate of Texas to the Texas Board of Licensure for Professional Medical Physicists in 1999 and continued to serve on this Board under Governor Perry's administration till 2011.Dr. Krishen was awarded Bharat Samman, the highest honour given by the Non-Resident Indian (NRI) Institute in 2006. The award was presented by His Excellency Sir Michael Arthur, KCMG, the British High Commissioner to India. He was awarded Hind Rattan, the highest award given by NRIW Society in 2008. The award was presented by Hon. Sushil Kumar Shinde, Union Minister for Power, Government of India.

Brief Report of the Event:

The Department of Physics and Electronics, Jain (Deemed-to-be-University) in collaboration with the Society for Space Education, Research and Development (SSERD) had organized a public talk by Dr. Kumar Krishen (Senior Scientist, Johnson Space Centre, NASA) on the occasion of International Moon's Day (20th July) at the School of Sciences, JC road campus. Dr. Krishen was in Bengaluru as part of a tour talking and inspiring students and public in general about space and NASA and is being hosted by SSERD. The talk was attended by about100+participants were there including UG/PG




Figure 135.2 Speaker & Participants of the event




Figure 135.3 Poster of the event

Brief Report of the Event:

The three-day event focused on students from 5th semester BcGBt (Biochemistry, Genetics and Biotechnology) combination as they aren't exposed to microbiological labs, practices and techniques. The faculty of Dept. of Microbiology & Botany conducted this workshop to give an exposure to the basic microbiological skills, microbiology lab organisation and practices. 53 students attended the training and they were divided into 2 batches. The session began by introducing the importance of microbiological skills by Dr. Ashwini N, HoD, Dept. of Life Sciences, School of Sciences, Jain (Deemed-to-be University). Thereafter the students were sent to Microbiology labs for sessions. One of the



batch was trained by Dr. Deepthi.B.V and Dr. Nandhini.M and the other batch was trained by Dr.

Nayana Borah and Dr. Asha Kademane. The topics covered in the three-day training were:

Day 1:

Microscopy

Preparation for sterilization (Preparation of cotton plugs, wrapping of petriplates)

Preparation of nutrient agar and MRBA media

Explanation about Autoclave, LAF, Incubator and different types of media

Sterilization of working space, LAF.

Serial dilution of water sample

Pour plate and spread plate method

Students prepared NA and NRBA media for pour and spread plate method of inoculation and dilution tubes for serial dilution. They learnt to handle petri-plates, pour media to plates and then exposed the plates to different environments for isolation of microbes from air. After exposure they placed the plates in the incubator for bacterial growth.

Day 2:

Preparation of media for carbohydrate fermentation test.

Streaking of bacterial culture and pure culture of fungi

Staining techniques (Gram staining, simple staining)

Wet mount technique for fungal staining

Students prepared sucrose, lactose and glucose fermentation broth and inoculated water sample to those tubes. They streaked the bacterial culture onto the petriplates. They learnt the staining of bacteria and fungi.

Day 3:

Results of carbohydrate fermentation test

Colony characteristics of fungi and bacteria

Feedback

During the last session, they learnt about the carbohydrate fermentation broth, interpretation of the results of carbohydrate fermentation broth and they learnt the colony characteristics of the bacteria and fungi on the air exposed plates.




Figure 137.1 Participants listening to the Guest Speaker




Figure 138.2 Poster of the event




Figure 139.3 Poster of the event




Figure 140.2 Poster of the event

Ceramics are one of the first materials used by mankind for day to day applications like clay pot, ceramic tiles, clay pipes, bricks, dinner ware sanitary ware etc. which are now classified as traditional ceramics. With advancement in science and technology variety of new ceramic materials were developed. These ceramic materials show attractive properties like light weight, high refractoriness (High temperature withstanding), strength retention at high temperature, good ware and corrosion resistance, chemical inertness, biocompatibility etc. As a result, they find multidimensional applications in various branches of industry like electronic, magnetic, structural, textile, aerospace, chemical, nuclear as well as biomedical. These materials, which include oxides, carbides, nitrides, borides, phosphates etc. and their composites fall under the category of advanced ceramics.

This presentation gave a brief introduction about the traditional and advanced ceramic materials. Various application areas of advanced ceramics were highlighted. Few preparation and fabrication methods were explained with examples.
