The Chairman extended a warm welcome to all the members for the 24th Meeting of the Academic Council. He informed the members that the last Academic Council had discussed on the introduction of new programmes for the academic year 2017-18. In this Academic Council, discussions will be taken up on the revision / fine-tuning of Curriculum Matrix and Syllabus of ongoing programmes that are going to be effective from the academic year 2017-18.

After these preliminary remarks, the Chairman took up the Agenda items for discussion.

Agenda item No. 1 - Confirmation of the minutes of the 23rd meeting held on 25th February, 2017.

The Chairman informed that the copy of the minutes was circulated to all the members and there were no particular suggestions / observations received and therefore he requested the members to confirm the minutes of the last meeting.

The members gave their approval to confirm the minutes of the 23rd meeting of the Academic Council held on 25th February, 2017.

Agenda item no. 2 - Action taken report on : Sanction was obtained from the Board of Management on 18th March, 2017, to introduce the New programmes approved by the Academic Council for the year 2017-18.

The Chairman informed that the new programmes which were approved in the last Academic Council meeting were placed before the meeting of Board of Management on **27**th **May, 2017**. After detailed discussion, the Board accorded its sanction to start these new programmes in the Academic year 2017-18.

Members appreciated the action taken.



Agenda item no. 3: Discussion items:

The Chairman informed the members that there are many items coming under (a) New Syllabus for the 3-year UG programmes coming under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) of Semesters III & IV (2016 batch) under agenda item no. 3.1 and (b) New Syllabus & Revised / fine-tuned Curriculum Matrix / Syllabus of ongoing batches under agenda item no. 3.2. These new syllabus / revisions have already been thoroughly discussed and recommended by the respective Boards of Studies of various Faculties. All the details pertaining to these have been circulated by email to all the members for their perusal. Presently, the hardcopy of the complete set of new syllabus, revised & fine-tuned curriculum matrix and syllabus are now placed before the Academic Council.

The Chairman felt that for the sake of Power Point Presentation only a few selected programmes could be taken up.

Agenda item no. 3.1: To approve the New Syllabus for the following programmes coming under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) of Semesters III & IV (2016 batch):

As a preliminary remark on the agenda points for the discussion items, Dr. J. Uchil, Director, Academics & Planning mentioned that the 3-year UG programmes with CBCS pattern as per the UGC guidelines was discussed in depth in the Academic Council of 21st April, 2016 and they were introduced in the last year (2016 batch). In that meeting, the Council had given approval for the entire Curriculum Matrix (of Semesters I to VI) and Syllabus of Semesters I & II. Now, the syllabus of Semesters III and IV, Faculty wise, have been placed before the Academic Council for approval.

With regard to the Syllabus of Semesters III & IV, Dr. B.A. Vasu briefly gave details on the B.Com courses, Dr. Sandeep Shastri highlighted on the BA courses. Prof. Dinesh Nilkant gave a brief on the BBA course and B.Sc. (Physical Sciences) was dealt by Dr. J Uchil.

There was a discussion with regard to the Language papers in Generic Elective under Semester III & IV of B.Com. course. Dr. Gururaja was of the opinion that the Language papers are not specific to the commerce discipline and suggested to relook into the need of such papers. Dr. Rajani Jairam and Dr. H.N. Prakruthi stressed that the topics in the Language papers will be related to the Commerce discipline which are offered by Faculty of Commerce, for example, the Sanskrit paper in Generic Elective will have Arthashastra, which gives knowledge of economics to the students. Dr. Vinod suggested to rename the title of 'Gandhian Thoughts and Literary Responses' to 'Gandhian Thought and Literary Responses' in Generic Elective of Semester III. Dr. B.R. Rao suggested to rename the title of 'Stock Market Operations' to 'Capital Market Operations' under Skill Enhancement Course of Semester III. Dr. Vasu agreed to consider the suggestions made.

Members accorded approval for the New Syllabus for all the 3-year programmes coming under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) of Semesters III & IV (2016 batch).



Agenda item no. 3.2: Presentation of the recommendations from various Boards of Studies (BoS) by the Deans of Faculties / HoDs. (Revision in Curriculum Matrix / New Syllabus, if any, will be effective from Academic year 2017-18.)

3.2.1. Faculty of Commerce

Dr. S.A. Hariprasad informed the members that CBCS pattern as per UGC guidelines have been implemented in the B.Tech courses from 2017 onwards. Curriculum



Matrix and Syllabus of Semester I & II are common for all streams. He presented the CBCS Structure with a template of credit allocation for Electronics & Communication Engineering as follows:

Dr. J. Gururaja appreciated the work done with regard to the implementation of CBCS pattern in all B.Tech courses by the Board of Studies as per UGC Guidelines. The Chairman advised Dr. Hariprasad to take experts opinion in consultation with the external members, namely, Dr. R. Natarajan, Dr. J. Gururaja and Prof. E.S. Dwarakadasa before starting the courses under CBCS pattern. In the Curriculum Matrix the Open Electives which are going to be offered by the concerned department was listed under Open Electives, Dr. Sandeep Shastri pointed out that actually it should be Open Electives offered to the students from other departments. Dr. Hariprasad readily agreed to correct the Curriculum Matrix accordingly.

- b. To approve the revised Curriculum Matrix / Syllabus for the following programmes :
 - i. Revised Curriculum Matrix Semesters VII and VIII (2014 batch) -
 - B.Tech. in Aerospace Engineering

Dr. Hariprasad gave a brief background on the revision made in the Curriculum Matrix of Semesters VII & VIII (2014 batch) in order to accommodate Internship. Dr. Natarajan and Dr. Gururaja mentioned that the internship / project work must be aimed at giving more industry exposure. Dr. Uchil suggested to make it mandatory to receive & evaluate the Internship Report just like that of Project Report.

- ii. New Syllabus Sem III to VI (2016 batch) -
 - B.Tech. in Computer Science & Engineering (CSE)
 - B.Tech. in CSE (with specialization in Cloud Technology and Information Security / Cloud Technology and Mobile Applications)
 - B.Tech. in Information Science & Engineering (ISE)

Dr. Hariprasad briefly presented the new syllabus from Semesters III to VI of the above programmes introduced in 2016. Dr. R. Natarajan suggested to look into renaming the title of the specialization from 'Cloud Technology and Information Security' to 'Cloud Technology and Cyber Security' as Cyber Security covers Information Technology, Computers and Internet. Dr. Hariprasad agreed to look into the suggestions after an interactive session with experts from these areas.

iii. Revision of Curriculum Matrix and Syllabus in the following 8 M.Tech programmes - Sem I to IV (2017 batch) -

- 1. M.Tech. in Aerospace Engineering (with specialization in Aerospace Structures).
- 2. M.Tech. in Aerospace Engineering (with specialization in Avionics).
- 3. M.Tech. in Aerospace Engineering (with specialization in Aerodynamics).
- 4. M.Tech. in Aerospace Engineering (with specialization in Aircraft Propulsion).
- 5. M.Tech. in Computer Science & Engineering
- 6. M.Tech. in Embedded System Design
- 7. M.Tech. in Energy Management & Climate Change Technology
- 8. M.Tech. in Food Technology

Prof. Sridhara Murthi highlighted on the revision made in the Curriculum Matrix to bring in uniformity of credits across all M.Tech courses. 'Research Methodology' was newly added as a core paper under Semester III. Dr. Natarajan suggested to include subject specialization in Missiles and Space-related propulsion in M.Tech. (Aerospace Engineering) courses. Prof. Murthi agreed to include after discussions with concerned organizations like DRDO / ISRO & others.

Dr. Sandeep Shastri briefly explained on the revised Curriculum Matrix and Syllabus of MPA in Dance and MPA in Music. He stated that the elements in the topics covered have been made in consonance with the title of the paper.

Prof. Sridhara Murthi mentioned that there had been two main aspects to the revisions proposed in the Curriculum Matrix of Semester I of the MBA programme in Airport, Aviation & International Business Management, namely, (a) addition of introductory background course on 'Commercial Aviation Business' to empower the students when they undertake industry visits / internship during the intersession period between Semesters I & II, and (b) addition of "Computer Application for Business activities" as a core course instead of value adding activity based on the feedback received from industry representatives during consultation process. He also mentioned that detailed syllabus drawn in accordance with the Curriculum



Matrix approved earlier for the Semesters III & IV of the above programme is now placed for approval of the Academic Council. The details of revision that are going to be done in the following 5 MBA programmes for AY 2017-18 will be dealt in next Academic Council.

i. Master of Business Administration (Single specialization in : Marketing)

ii. Master of Business Administration (Single specialization in : Finance)

iii. Master of Business Administration (Entrepreneurship and Family Business Management)

iv. Master of Business Administration(Dual specialization in : Marketing & Finance)

v. Master of Business Administration (Dual specialization in : Marketing & Human Resource Management)

Dr. K.N. Varalakshmi and Dr. T. Padmavathi briefed the changes made in M.Sc. in Biotechnology and M.Sc. in Microbiology respectively as details given above.

The Chairman appreciated the members for the discussions. He made an appeal to all the Deans / HoDs to avoid fine-tuning / revision of the Syllabus every year, as it is causing burden to the Examination Unit. Instead, fine-tuning / revision can be brought in once in 2 or 3 years. However, introduction of new & innovative courses are always welcome.

The Academic Council approved the revised Curriculum Matrix & Syllabus specified in the agenda 3.2 for 26 PG programmes which are effective from the academic year 2017-18.



Agenda item no. 4: Reporting Item:

4.1. Applied for NAAC Reassessment.

The Chairman reminded the members that the University was planning to go for NAAC Reassessment. He was happy to inform the members that, the Letter of Intent submitted to NAAC has been accepted and University is going to upload the Self Study Report within a couple of weeks. There could be a visit of NAAC peer team during June / July 2017.

Agenda item no. 5: Any other matter:

Agenda item no. 5.1.: B.Sc. (Hons.) in Forensic Science – Revised Syllabus of Semesters I & II – 2017 batch.

Dr. J Uchil informed the members that the new B.Sc. (Hons.) course in Forensic Science slated to start from this year (2017) was discussed in the last Academic Council meeting and the Curriculum Matrix and Syllabus of Semesters I & II were approved. This course is going to be recognized by the Chartered Society of Forensic Sciences (CSOFS). In this regard, CSOFS has suggested a few changes in the Syllabus contents in certain papers of Semesters I & II and the Curriculum Matrix remains unchanged. The changes suggested in the Syllabus of Semesters I & II were circulated to the Board of Studies of Forensic Science and we have received their recommendation to adopt those changes. Now, the revised Syllabus of Semesters I & II for B.Sc. (Hons.) in Forensic Science for 2017 batch is placed before the Academic Council and requested for the approval.

The Academic Council approved the revised Syllabus for Semesters I & II of B.Sc. (Hons.) in Forensic Science for 2017 batch.

Agenda item no. 5.2.: Karnataka State Universities Rating Framework

The Chairman was happy to inform the august gathering that the Executive Committee of the Karnataka State Higher Education Council, Department of Higher Education, Government of Karnataka on the recommendation of the duly appointed agency ICARE RATINGS has rated Jain University as a four star institution with a score of 661 out of 1000 in the Category of Young University (5 to 10 years) on the basis of comprehensive performance metrics as set out in the Karnataka State Universities Rating Framework (KSURF) in its notification dated 31st March, 2017. Jain University is placed 2nd in the Karnataka Universities Score Card in the category of Young Universities.

Members congratulated the University Management and appreciated the efforts put in for this success.



Agenda item no. 5.3.: Programmes offered for AY 2017-18 and sanctioned intake thereof.

The Chairman informed that after successful implementation of Choice Based Credit System in the University for 3-year UG programmes in AY 2016-17, the Choice Based Credit System for B.Tech programmes will be implemented from the AY 2017-18.

Out of the total 76 Programmes being offered for AY 2017-18, 27 UG programmes and 11 B.Tech programmes will have the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS), 35 PG and PhD programmes will continue with Elective course system and PG Diploma in Sports Psychology / Counselling will be standalone.

Discussions were held on the sanctioned intake for ongoing and new programmes offered in 2017-18, based on a presentation made by the Registrar to the Academic Council. The following intake was finally approved by the Academic Council:
