The Chairman extended a warm welcome to all the members and special invitees to the 30th Meeting of the Academic Council. He informed that this meeting is primarily held to have discussions on the (i) new UG / PG Programmes for the academic year 2019-20, (ii) new Syllabus for Semesters III & IV of 2018 batch, (iii) new Syllabus for Semesters V & VI of 2017 batch and (iv) revised / fine-tuned Curriculum Matrix & Syllabus. The proposals received for new programmes are a list of 29 which were discussed in the Standing Committee to look into the feasibility and need aspects of introducing these programmes. A set of 6 programmes were shortlisted from the proposed list and were placed before the meeting of the Planning & Monitoring Board held on 23rd March, 2019 for their consideration. After detailed discussion, the Planning & Monitoring Board recommended to forward the suggested changes in the proposed Curriculum Matrix and modules to be incorporated in the syllabus of various programmes to the Boards of Studies in the respective areas for the needful action.

The relevant background papers of all the agenda items, Curriculum Matrix & Syllabus of Semesters I & II for all the new programmes and revised / fine-tuned Curriculum Matrix and Syllabus of ongoing UG / PG programmes received from concerned Board of Studies have already been circulated and also placed on the table for ready reference of the Members.

The Chairman mentioned that while circulating all the background papers to the esteemed Members of Academic Council a request note was made to the recipients to go through the documents and come with specific suggestions so as to have a point to point discussion and

save time. As such there was only one reply from Dr. Mythili P Rao, which will be discussed under the concerned agenda items.

The Chairman briefly introduced Prof. K.R. Sridhara Murthi who has been appointed as the Director (Academics and Planning) of the University as successor to late Dr. Jayagopal Uchil. He also introduced Dr. S. Ghoshal and Dr. N. Chandrasekhar to the august gathering who have been invited as special invitees to present the new programmes on Design and the new MBA specializations respectively.

Thereafter, the Chairman took up the agenda items for discussion.

Agenda item No. 1 - Confirmation of the minutes of the 29th meeting held on 25th August, 2018.

The Chairman informed that the copy of the minutes was circulated to all the members and that there were no suggestions / observations received in this matter. He requested the members to confirm the minutes of the last meeting.

The members confirmed the minutes of the 29th meeting of the Academic Council held on 25th August, 2018.

Agenda item no. 2 : Discussion items :

Agenda item no. 2.1 : To approve the new programmes proposed to be introduced for the Academic Year 2019-20 :

The Chairman requested the concerned programme coordinators to present the Curriculum Matrix before the Members.

Dr. Ghosal made a presentation on the proposal to introduce following B.Des and M.Des programmes under School of Design :

He informed that the nomenclature is strictly adhering to UGC guidelines and the curriculum to AICTE requirements. He presented the Curriculum Matrices of B.Des programme which is of 4 years duration and M.Des programme which is of 2 years duration. The programme objective is to take the students through a formal design process including the process of opportunity seeking for creative and innovative developments. Other aims are to expose the students to the process of 'designing communications elements, processes & systems' with reasonable understanding of technology, material, requisite expertise in allied software and finally the viability of achieving results. A unique feature of some of the courses is that they will be delivered continuously over a group of one or two weeks so that the students may assimilate easily and also generate creative output. Dr. Gururaja suggested that the evaluation of designs made by learners should be based on well-defined & objective criteria and books for reference should be listed in each subject. Mr. Vora suggested while designing a product, its utility and competitiveness in the market need to be ascertained. Dr. Ghosal mentioned that he shall look into those suggestions and clarified that design process imparted through the course integrates several attributes of creative designs and attempts to develop visualization skills. Value for a design is provided through design thinking, design process and design management. Dr. Rajan Varghese suggested to have a course in the area of copyright. Dr. Ghosal informed that a module on IPR has been a part of the syllabus developed for B.Des and M.Des programmes.

3. Bachelor of Business Administration
(Specialization in Entrepreneurship)

Dr. Dinesh Nilkant presented the Curriculum Matrix for BBA (Specialization in Entrepreneurship). This programme with a unique concept of world of work will create a platform for the students to have real time learning of the industry. Students shall undergo internship and class sessions in tandem. Mr. Vora suggested to ensure digital technology & talent management topics are covered. Dr. Dinesh clarified that the Entrepreneurship Lab shall cover digital technology topics and People Management course shall cover talent management. The Registrar stated that more practical oriented subjects have been included to offer specialization, unlike the regular BBA programme through inclusion of three lab courses, namely, Marketing Lab, Business

Accounting Lab & Entrepreneurship Lab. Dr. Natarajan sought to know whether the students of UG programme can cope up with subjects on a huge area like entrepreneurship. Dr. Dinesh informed that the candidates choosing this BBA programme are mainly those who are interested in starting a business or having their own family business and the programme shall give foundation towards entrepreneurial development. Dr. Gururaja pointed out that topics on investment and finance interface between institutions need to be covered in the curriculum, Mr. Vora added that cash flow management is also important. Dr. Dinesh mentioned that the suggestions will be considered.

Dr. Chandrasekhar presented the Curriculum Matrix for two new specializations, Logistics & Supply Chain Management and Systems & Operations Management under MBA programme. He mentioned that Semester I is common for all MBA programmes. Mr. Vora pointed that subjects like SCM should also deal with automation of information in real-time and Dr. Gururaja added that the topics on Risk Management and Data Security also need to be considered. Dr. Chandrasekhar agreed to the suggestions.

Mr. Pratish Nair presented the above three programmes which have been designed and offered through University – Industry Interaction with the most prominent institution in the country in the field of Branding promoted by Brand Guru, Mr. Prahalad Kakkar. He added that BMS programme offer highly practice oriented brand management courses which help to fine-tune business concepts and guide how to identify entrepreneurial opportunities.

The Registrar informed that all the BMS programmes are normalized to have common Core papers with a total of 80 credits. Semesters I and II shall also be common for all BMS programmes across the University. Discipline Specific Electives (DSE), Generic Electives (GE) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) will be made specific to each specialization of BMS programmes which are going to be offered from Semester III. The total credits of 148 shall remain same.

The Chairman informed that the suggestions and feedback given by the members need to be incorporated in the Curriculum Matrix and Syllabus of these new programmes.

Members accorded approval for introduction of new programmes proposed for the academic year 2019-20, subject to the incorporation of the suggested changes in the Curriculum Matrix / Syllabus.

Agenda item no. 3.1 : Calendar of Events for AY 2019-20.

The Chairman informed that the Calendar of Events for the academic year 2019-20 have been circulated to all the members for their reference which was duly approved by the Standing Committee of the University.

Agenda item no. 3.2 : Programmes offered for AY 2019-20 and sanctioned intake thereof.

The Chairman informed that out of 108 Programmes being offered for AY 2019-20, 45 UG and 17 PG programmes will have Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) as per UGC guidelines. Fourteen (14) B.Tech, 11 M.Tech, 14 MBA, 1 MCA, 1 B.Des and 1 M.Des programmes will follow CBCS as per AICTE guidelines. PG Diploma programme in Information Technology and the PhD programme will follow Elective Course System, and PG Diploma in Sports Psychology / Counselling will standalone without electives.

1. A maximum permissible deviation of 10%, with due approval of the Vice Chancellor.
2. Allotment of seats to reserved categories as per the guidelines of Government of Karnataka.
3. Provision for admission of foreign students' upto 20% over and above the sanctioned strength.

4. By virtue of a MoU signed between Jain and “EDCIL (India) Ltd. – SII”, being an eligible institution by virtue of NAAC grading of 3.31 and NIRF ranking, the University is permissible to admit foreign students with Government of India “SII Scholarships”.

The Academic Council took note of the above and gave its approval.

Agenda item no. 3.5 : Action Taken Report on the Feedback from the stakeholders for the AY 2018-19.

The Director, IQAC briefed the Members on the outcome of action taken on the structured curriculum feedback for design and review of Syllabus received from the stakeholders, namely, Students, Faculty members, Potential Employers and Alumni.

It was observed that as per the feedback from stakeholders, a few Courses / Specializations were strengthened :

1. Courses on Communicative English Lab, Sociology & Elements of Indian History for Engineers and Energy Studies were strengthened with a few more sessions for all students of Department of Engineering and Technology and offered as Mandatory Courses.
2. The B.Tech programme under Department of Computer Science and Engineering was offered as Industry led specialized programmes, namely, Data Science, Internet of Things, Artificial Intelligence, Cloud Technology and Mobile Applications. In addition, Problem Solving through Programming Lab and various Discipline Specific Electives and Skill Enhancing Courses were introduced across all departments.
3. As per the stakeholders of Department of Management Studies, a minor revision in the Marketing subjects was considering based on the recent global trends in MBA

programme. Courses on Indian Ethos & Business Ethics, Corporate Social Responsibility & Sustainability and Indian Economy and Policy were strengthened to cover life skills and on the aspects of fundamental duties.

4. As per recommended for curriculum oriented towards hands-on skill, analytical abilities with effectiveness for developing innovative thinking, new specializations, namely, Business Analytics, Logistics and Supply Chain Management and Systems and Operations Management, were introduced based on the requirements for MBA programme. New course titled 'Artificial intelligence for HRM' was offered under CBCS for MBA programme.
5. Employers of passing out students from the Department of Computer Science and IT had recommended for more course contents to cover human resources and developing innovative thinking. Hence, courses on Python Programming, Introduction to UI – UX, Introduction to AI, and Introduction to Big Data which are of emerging trends were introduced for developing innovative thinking for BCA specialization programmes.

Members noted and expressed their appreciation for taking action on the feedback from the Stakeholders for the AY 2018-19.
