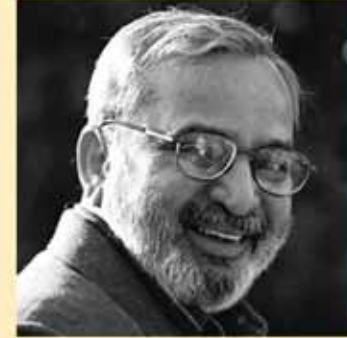

Shri U.R. Ananthamurthy

Padma Bhushan Shri. Udupi Rajagopalacharya Ananthamurthy was that supreme storyteller, popular teacher, generous mentor of young writers and fierce public intellectual who transcended each of those descriptions. A committed Indian *bhasha* enthusiast, Ananthamurthy wrote entirely in Kannada, with the exception of an occasional lecture or essay in English. Jnanapeeth awardee Shri. U.R. Ananthamurthy was one of the pioneers of the *Navya* movement. His writings are a reflection of the manner in which individuals deal with situations that are unusual and challenging. They also happen to be deep engagements with the element of modernity crisscrossing traditional socio-political and economic structures and values bringing in remarkable changes forcing traditional forms of life to restructure themselves. Ananthamurthy's works capture the tensions, conflicts and contradictions of postcolonial societies like India and it is for this reason that they become crucial cultural texts that help us understand the paradoxical nature of our times.

Dr. Ashis Nandy



Dr. Ashis Nandy is an Indian political psychologist, social theorist and critic. A Senior Fellow and Former Director of Centre for the Study of Developing Societies (CSDS) for several years, Prof. Nandy has co-authored a number of human rights reports and is active in movements for peace, alternative sciences and technologies, and cultural survival. His research interests centre on the political psychology of violence, cultures of knowledge, utopias and visions, human potentialities, and futures. He held the first UNESCO Chair at the Center for European Studies, University of Trier in 1994. In 2006 he became the National Fellow of the Indian Council of Social Science Research.

Prof. Nandy has been honoured with the prestigious Fukuoka Asian Culture Prize in 2007. In 2008 he appeared on the list of the Top 100 Public Intellectuals Poll of the Foreign Policy magazine. He has authored more than 20 books and published more than 100 research articles.
